The Ask, Petition for Change

We are asking for Volusia County to lift the dogs on the beach ban that has been in place since 1987. We are asking for the area between Zelda and University Blvds (½ mile stretch) to be designated dog friendly. It is located halfway between Lighthouse Pointe Park (inland beach) and Flagler

County dog beach (oceanside). Environmental impacts to this Urban area are considered negligible. Sea turtle nesting, shore birds and dunes in these areas are minimal and this section has very low human population, even during peak seasons. This area also is a driving section of the beach

which would allow access for people with physical limitations and handicaps.

The beginnings of Daytona Dog Beach, Inc., in many ways, began in 2017 when our board of directors met while supporting Halifax Humane Society (HHS). Paula Flug, at that time, was Animal Care Director at HHS, and Brenda Balas (along with Tim Balas), Mariah Petrella, and Nanette McKeel Petrella were volunteers. We came together that year in preparations for Furball, an annual fundraiser held at the Ocean Center. We bonded over Lady, and her 7 pups, who had been fostered by Mariah and Nanette. They were showcased that year at the furball. became great friends over that shared experience.



Four years later, Paula and Nanette would once again come together to found Daytona Dog Beach, Inc. after a grassroots Facebook Group, Daytona Dog Beach started by Robert Lewis began to rapidly grow in support of dog-friendly beaches in Volusia County. Later Brenda and Mariah joined the board.

Starting a non-profit and trying to lead change in the community can be daunting and at times very discouraging. Daytona Dog Beach, Inc. has continually tried to take a positive approach in pursuing the mission of our organization. There are several reasons we have been able to stay the course these last 2 years. Let me share one of those reasons with you:

We have found that every time we are feeling a bit down, something happens to bolster our morale, and give us the resolve to keep going. Such a happening took place late last year and into 2023. During our December People & Paws Beach Cleanup, a couple joined us on the cleanup. They didn't realize they could bring their dog, but once they realized they could, they joined us with their Bella, at our January cleanup. In the meantime, they reviewed the information about Daytona Dog Beach, Inc. As a result, we received an email from Jay, volunteering to fill one of our vacant volunteer positions, Budget and Finance Chair. The board met with Jay in January, and we are immensely pleased that he has joined us in that new role.

Better Cities for Pets Certification Leads to Business Opportunity



In August 2022, Daytona Dog Beach, Inc. spearheaded the effort that resulted in Daytona Beach receiving a Pet-Friendly Certification through the "Better Cities for Pets" program from Mars Petcare.

Since that time, DDBI has continued to interface with Mars Petcare on behalf of the city, applying for a grant to implement "People & Paws -Together in Daytona Beach" pets welcome program. While we did not receive one of the 7 - \$20,000 grants awarded in the USA in 2022, Mars judges were impressed with our grant application and commitment to making our city a more welcoming place for pets and pet parents & helping them be together.

Thus, they have provided us with key program materials to help launch our program. They also offered us consultative credit with the Civic Design Center, one of their key partners.

DDBI will be working with the City of Daytona Beach and local businesses to implement the program throughout 2023. Any Daytona Beach business interested in learning more are encouraged to email info@daytonadogbeach.org.

Longer term, we hope to work with other cities in Volusia County, as our organization represents the Greater Daytona Beach Area, which encompasses more than the City of Daytona Beach



We have reached out to Daytona Beach International Airport Management in hopes of securing them certification as a Pet-Friendly airport through Mars Petcare. The certification is in collaboration with the American Association of Airport Executives. There are currently only 5 airports in the USA so certified. Since DAB is within 90 miles of a certified city, they are eligible to apply for certification. DDBI hopes to support the airport in welcoming pets and their owners in the future.

Facts in Support of Dog Friendly Beaches: It's The Economy!!



We keep repeating this article. It is even more relevant in light of the catastrophic damage to our county's beaches from Hurricane Ian and Nicole. Now is the time to reach out to all tourists and embrace their needs and expectations, not give them another reason to go elsewhere.

Our own residents vacation in St Augustine, Cocoa Beach and elsewhere that have dog-friendly beaches. It's time Volusia gets with the times!! 

Mars Petcare - 2022 Annual Report



Daytona Dog Beach, Inc. makes every effort to listen to people, their concerns and opinions. Their perspectives are real to them and they matter, however they do not always reflect the reality of a situation. We attempt to research multiple sources in guiding our non-profits efforts in working with the community. To be objective, we try to prove the nay-sayers right. We want to make sure we are dealing with fact, not relying on our own perspectives.

While we do not rely on just one source, we do appreciate the information provided by Mars Petcare as it relates to their areas of expertise. We value the research they are doing to better understand how our relationship with pets might benefit our mental and physical health. With social isolation and loneliness on the rise in the U. S. and around the world, they've

partnered with leading organizations like the Human Animal Bond Research Institute and the National Institutes of Health to help scientists understand the role pets could play to address this serious public health problem.

Some of the key insights in the Report

- 92% of pet parents say their relationship with their pets **improved their mental and physical wellbeing** in the last three years.
- Pet parents say that pets improve their wellbeing by providing companionship (77%), emotional support (70%), a sense of purpose (52%) and a reason to exercise (31%).
- Among those considering a pet, 66% are concerned about **affordability**, 47% about **being away** for work or travel, and 42% about **finding pet-friendly housing**.
- 52% of pet parents plan to bring their pets when they resume traveling.
- 61% of those intending to adopt or foster will turn to **animal shelters or rescues**, a decision that is more critical than ever due to the current <u>shelter crisis</u>.

What People Share With Us, County Council Should Know

Over the last 2 years, we have heard from residents, tourists and those looking to relocate to our area. They all want dog-friendly beach options in Volusia County. We wanted to share what a few have told us.

I am a single woman, living in Daytona Beach. My dog is not only my companion, his presence helps ease my social anxiety. I love to take walks on the beach but hesitate to do so any more. On numerous occasions, I have come across individuals, who appear to be in an altered state, either sleeping near or under the beach ramps. I have also had some approach me on the beach, which is extremely scary. I do carry mace with me, but having my dog along with me would give me an added sense of security I need to once again enjoy the beach.

We were just in Daytona beach visiting and had our dog with us. We stayed at the Hilton oceanfront (which is dog friendly). Although the boardwalk is dog friendly, the beach is not. We drove to another city that had a dog friendly beach. I feel if Daytona were dog friendly all day, at least August to March, it would bring more people and sales at stores and restaurants in the area. With the beach not being dog friendly many people go and spend their money elsewhere. We spent spring break one year in Wilmington as Wrightsville beach is dog friendly. If we bring our dog to the area again we will stay at a dog friendly beach like St. Augustine. The change would be profitable to Volusia county and possibly bring a higher class of visitors to the area.

I'm disabled in DBS and I have a dog who loves playing in the waves. I am not able to walk to proposed sites and the VA took license due to seizures. I live down block from approach on Florida Shores Blvdbeach needs opened up. I have many neighbors who have dogs who go early in morning or late night with their dogs so everyone can enjoy beach.

I am a snow bird, spending 5-6 months on the beach in New Smyrna. I really would like to see all Volusia County beaches allow for dogs, even limited hours would be fine. Like before 10am, after 6pm, etc. Is your group looking at anything like this and if so, how can I help?

We live at Oceans Atrium condos in Daytona Beach Shores and are new to the area.

We have a Westie that we would love to take for a walk on the beach.

Hi! I'm new to this group but I'm very interested in helping to allow dogs on the beach in Volusia County. I moved to Volusia County last year and hate that I can't take my dogs to the beach. My in-laws have owned a condo in St. Augustine for the last 10 years and we have spent a lot of time on that beach. We have never seen feces, large holes, damage to turtle nests, etc. Maybe if we get some actual data from counties that allow dogs on the beach it would help our cause and combat the vague "possible" problems the county seems to keep referencing when denying dogs on the beach.
