

The event underscored the importance of community involvement and the positive impact of working together toward shared goals.












Sugar's Sweet Adventure

When we open our homes and hearts to a dog, we ultimately receive more than we give to them. Dogs come into our lives to teach us about love or give their love to help us mend our broken hearts from a loss. They spend their remaining life with us and take a bit of our hearts when we have to say goodbye.

Sugar came into my family through the way of my mother in 2012. Her vet, Doc, volunteered with Seminole County Animal Services and suggested to her that she adopt Sugar to help with the mourning of her last dog, Cocoa. Sugar was just over a year old and, in typical puppy fashion, gave my mother some challenging days. When I would come home, she would immediately come to me and not leave my side. While she was my mother's dog, it was clear to me that we had a special bond.

That bond intensified with my mother's sudden passing in 2015; Sugar then became mine. It was just her and me against the new world we found ourselves managing. She was my emotional support through losing my mother, my job of 15 years, and just trying to find my footing in life again; she gave me a reason to keep going. Fast-forward to December 2022, and I finally felt like I was reaching a point of stability, then her face started to swell. After several appointments and a biopsy, it was determined that she had a mass lesion consistent with a myxomatous neoplasia sarcoma.

This discovery began her cancer fight and my commitment to do everything in my power to save her as long as it didn't impact her quality of life. So away we went, adventuring to the UF Small Animal Hospital in February, and we did not finish traveling there until July. Along the way, I tried to give her as many additional adventures as she could tolerate between the surgeries and radiation treatments, making the most of the time we had together. During this period, I heard that Daytona Dog Beach, Inc. was trying to lift the 36-year ban on dogs at a section of Ormond Beach, and my first thought was that I hoped Sugar would live to experience it.

In July, the UF Radiation Department gave me the devastating news that the sarcoma was growing back, and they projected she would only have two months to live. I then began to put into action all the trips I had saved over the years for when I could find time or afford them. They were now her last adventures, and I was going to do whatever I could to make them happen. With Volusia County greenlighting the dog beach pilot program, I made sure to pencil in a visit to Ormond Beach after the 1st of November.

I am thrilled to share that Sugar surpassed the two-month projection. My resilient girl almost reached her 13th birthday before she was laid to rest on the 11th of July. We embarked on several memorable adventures that year, many of which took place in the dog-friendly section of Ormond Beach. The vast oceanfront provided us with the space to breathe, unwind, and stroll as if we were the only ones enjoying the water. These additional trips across Florida made me feel like I was fulfilling my promise to give her the quality of life she deserved.

In the end, I realized my dog would be happy just to be wherever I was, which makes opportunities like this pilot program even more critical to make permanent. It is hard to find places where dogs are allowed to enjoy life alongside their humans.

If you're reading this, I hope you understand the significance of creating those precious moments with your dog now rather than waiting for the perfect opportunity. The same applies to supporting Daytona Dog Beach, Inc. in any way you can. Every moment with your dog is a treasure, and it's up to us to make the most of it.


So what's next? I am taking time to get my life back on track after being on hold for nearly two years. Once my heart is ready, I thought about partnering with a local shelter to give one of their dogs a sweet "Sugar Day" adventure or <u>becoming a foster volunteer</u>.

Fil A Bag Stations & Mermaid Treasure Chests Coming Soon!

Daytona Dog Beach Inc is excited to be moving forward to sponsor 3 Fil A Bag Stations along the dog-friendly beach. The Fill A Bag station, founded in Key Biscayne, provides upcycled buckets for beachgoers to collect trash and debris during their visit. Fill A Bag Stations are designed to empower people to turn daily walks into meaningful beach cleanups. The Volusia County Coastal division works with local groups and organizations to sponsor a station along the coast.





In an effort to reduce waste and repurpose beach toys that might otherwise be thrown away, Volusia Coastal division will erect "Mermaid's Lost Treasure" boxes along the coast. Beachgoers who do not wish to bring beach toys home with them, or those who find a misplaced toy in the sand, can place them in the box for others to enjoy. DDBI is working with the county to sponsor 3 Mermaid Lost Treasure boxes along the dog-friendly beach.

- With our July cleanup results of 476 lb, our organization has now removed 3,774 lb of trash from Volusia Beaches since July 2021.
- 2,497 lb of the total was removed from the dog-friendly stretch in the first 9 months of this pilot.

Interview with Tamra Malphur Volusia County Beach Safety Director

Congratulations to Tammy who, just days after meeting her at the Lifeguard Tower at the Cardinal beach access point, was appointed by Volusia County Council to the position of Director for Volusia County Beach Safety Ocean Rescue. That's not something she takes lightly. She oversees all the 47 miles of beach in Volusia County. That includes about 45 full time beach safety specialists, known as "Senior Ocean Lifeguards" and from 150 to 200 seasonal part time guards that work during the summertime. The job of a lifeguard may look easy, but as Tammy explains there's a lot more responsibility, training and physical stamina that goes into the position than meets the eye. Maybe that's in part why there is currently a nationwide lifeguard shortage.







Volusia County has been proactive by starting guards out at \$17.00 an hour this year as well as offering bonuses for certain criteria for seasonal lifeguards. Many pools may close in the "off season" but the beach is open all year round and safety is the main concern. That's where stamina is paramount! What does it take to be a lifeguard? Tammy says before you are even considered for a position, you must be able to do: a 500-meter swim in 10 minutes or less, a 50-yard swim in less than 30 seconds and a half mile run in 3 minutes and 15 seconds! Then there's a week-long recruit class with technical drills and emergency medical responder training. When you complete training successfully, and get a position, every day before work, you must complete a physical drill of swimming and running. It may all sound physically challenging but once you're in your tower, consider this. YOU are responsible for the safety of all those enjoying the ocean within your line of vision. So, it's not about sitting in the chair working on your tan. It's being there, being hyper vigilant. It can be mentally exhausting just constantly scanning, watching for trouble that hopefully rarely happens. If it does happen, imagine saving a life! Everything you had to accomplish to be there allowed you to be there at the moment in time when you were needed the most.

Some good advice from Tammy for all beach enthusiasts: "Never underestimate the power of a rip current" and "always swim in front of a staffed lifeguard tower."

If you think a lifeguard's responsibility ends there, that's not the case. Tammy says the beach changes every day. Surf can change even during the same day from flat to hazardous. Weather conditions including tides must be constantly monitored. If you ever arrived at the beach and were told you had to wait to drive on, it's because during turtle nesting season, Turtle Patrol drives the entire beach looking for new turtle nests. Lifeguards also keep an eye on the nests during the day and provide information to visitors to keep the nests safe. Driving on the beach during turtle nesting season, May 1 to October 31, is from 8am to 7pm. From November 1 to April 30, beach driving is permitted from sunrise to sunset.

Tammy may have been born in Syracuse, New York, but she has lived in Daytona Beach all her life and describes herself as a "beach bum". She attended Holly Hill Elementary, Holly Hill Junior High and Mainland High School. After graduation, she went back to upstate New York to attend Veterinary Medicine School. It didn't take her long to find, the cold weather was not for her. While there however, she became a Volunteer Firefighter, went to EMT school and became a certified EMT. That's what introduced her to the public safety aspect of going on calls and helping people. That "switch of gears" brought her away from Veterinary Medicine, back to Florida and back to the beach where she saw a truck with "Lifeguard /EMT" on the side drive by and Tammy said, "right then I knew exactly what I wanted to do". She started off as a lifeguard and has been with Beach Safety for 27 years.

Her love of animals however has never left. It started as a child spending summers on her aunt's dairy farm taking care of the cows. It doesn't matter the animal; Tammy enjoys them all. She couldn't imagine working indoors with all the wonderful nature outdoors to experience. She does admit, dogs however, are her favorites. She's "never been without a dog" and "couldn't see myself without a dog."

Top of her list? Bettis. He is a Boston Terrier and is 10 years old. Yes, "Bettis" is named after Jerome Bettis, the former Pittsburgh Steelers running back, who is her son's favorite football player. Tammy says "Bettis" may be 10 but he's still a playful pup. His favorite? Frisbee! Give him a frisbee and he will play "as long as you let him".

Lifeguards play an important role on dog beach. They educate visitors about the rules. One "misconception" Tammy hears a lot is, sometimes a lifeguard may get a report of a dog on a beach where dogs are not allowed. Once it is brought to the attention of a lifeguard, they will investigate. After talking to the animals' owner, they may find the dog is a service animal. Service animals are allowed in areas where dogs who are not service animals would not be allowed. Tammy says, in that case, here's what happens. "A call is placed over the radio to alert other lifeguards to the situation and they relay what they have learned after talking to the dog's owner. Once verified that it is indeed a service animal, other lifeguards will not stop and bother the person again and again. Tammy says, observers may then see it as "nothing is being done" or "lifeguards are just driving by them." That is not the case and she wants to get the word out so others understand the steps that are being taken to assure the rules are being followed.

It was delightful getting to know Tammy and again Congratulations on her new position as Director for Volusia County Beach Safety Ocean Rescue. She wants us all to remember, "One way to be sure you have everything you need to know, no matter what beach you are visiting in Volusia County is to download the "Volusia Beaches App." It has all the "real time" information you need for everything, from where staffed lifeguard towers are located, to what beach access ramps are open or closed, off beach parking information, even restrooms."






