We are especially pleased to based, research publish our May newsletter, as it serves to celebrate the 3-year anniversary of Daytona Dog tourists, Beach, Inc., registered as a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization funding used to purchase all on May 5, 2021. As founding board members, Paula Flug, Vice President, and myself have served in our roles from the beginning. Navigating the start-up of a non-profit is not for the faint of heart, especially when you begin from scratch. Through all the ups and downs, wins and losses, life's challenges and demands, we have supported one another, and advanced our mission. The mission has always been the heart of our efforts. Paula and I are pleased that Brenda Balas, Secretary, and Barry KuKes, Treasurer, have agreed to serve on our board. Their perspective and contributions are appreciated and valued. We also acknowledge each and every person who supported us, in numerous ways and at various times along the journey. We would not have gotten to this point without everyone's support.

As we reflect over the past 3 years, we are proud to have led a beachside community driven effort that resulted in approval of an 18-month pilot program, ending a 37-year ban of dogs on the beach in our county. We did so with a positive, fact

supported approach that garnered support from residents, businesses and government agencies. The twenty-six dog-bag dispensers and the 18-month supply of dog bags was funded by private donations, at no taxpayer cost.

In our fourth year, our focus is continuing support of the 18month dog-friendly beach pilot. Our volunteer team, Paw Ambassadors, has been hosting the dog-friendly beach over the first 6-months of the pilot. These volunteers have all undergone county delivered training, model good dog owner behavior on the beach, engage beach goers to share the rules, clean-up the beach, and provide data to the county. They have removed 1211 lb. of trash from the dogfriendly stretch in the first 6 months of this pilot. 


We express our gratitude for all who volunteered through the month of April. Your dedication and patience got us through the 6th month of our pilot, 1/3 of the way. Whew! And we made it through the worst winter months in a long time, the Rolex and Daytona 500, Bike Week, Spring Break, Easter Week, and Jeep Beach.

With our April cleanup results of 216 lb, we removed 2,488 lb of trash from Volusia Beaches since July 2021. 1211 lb of the 2,488 lb was collected by our volunteers on our dog-friendly beach. It is a shame people don't clean up, but what a valued service our volunteers are providing to keep our beach and ocean cleaner. Thank You!!! The best news is we seldom find any dog poo!!



She says thanks to the beach, she has experienced some weight loss so she is happy about that. She loves seeing people and their dogs enjoying the beach and hopes the section of beach becomes permanent and expands. Like the other Paw Ambassadors, she says that she has only encountered a dog poop once in 6-months. An Interview with Angela Miedema- Volusia County Animal Services Director

It was a perfect afternoon with sun and a beautiful breeze when Angela Meidema, Director of Animal Services of Volusia County, and her dog Sky, joined me under the Ormond Beach Lifeguard Tower at Cardinal Drive. We of course, talked about Dog Beach as well as many other topics, including her background and how she got here!

Angela's career began where she grew up, in Michigan. During that time she served as Executive Director of The Humane Animal Treatment Society Animal Services and worked with several non profits. She was also a Mounted Police Officer in Michigan which gave her a background in law enforcement as well!

Angela came to Florida 3 years ago and started as a behaviorist with Orange County Animal Services. In August, she will mark one year in her position here in Volusia County.



Angela takes her position as Director of Animal Services of Volusia County very seriously. Her priorities are public safety and animal safety. She also feels education is very important so all pet owners are more responsible with their pets.

Although Angela explained, she did work on the beach of Lake Michigan, Volusia County has some of the longest beach areas in the state. That means a lot of mileage and many more opportunities to offer education and guidance.

Sharing the environment and making it a place where all can enjoy

spending their time, is where much of Angela's focus lies. "It's turtle hatching season and that means being mindful of the nests and everyone should be aware that there are areas people and dogs should know about so we are not disturbing the environment." Especially in the dune or restoration areas.

Angela says "It's a collaborative effort so we are making sure we are cognizant of the things and others around us".

That's why it's important to follow the rules while on Dog Beach. Angela knows many see Animal Services coming and may think, "Oh they are going to take away my dog or they are here for some negative reason. Typically we are here just to make sure that you are doing OK, that your pet is doing OK, we are here to help. We are here to help in any situation. Whether that means, maybe I need a little bit of extra water for my pet that day." Angela wants everyone to know "We are the animal professionals of the county, we are here to help you". "We are here to make sure everyone has equal opportunity at the beach and they all have access to have a wonderful day."

As part of the education component, it starts with knowing the rules of Dog Beach. Angela explains, Volusia County Animal Control follows all Chapter 14 ordinances which are the state statues.

"Cleaning up after your pet is a very big one. Back to the environmental concerns, no one wants to step on that during a beautiful barefoot day at the beach." "There are many bag stations here just in case you need them".

It's also important to keep your dogs on a leash. Angela reminds us, "everyone wants to have a safe day, some may be allergic, there are small kids, and you never know how an animal may react to some things." "It's important for your pets' safety too. There are vehicles that drive on the beach so we want them safe in that regard."

Leashes can be no longer than 6 feet. Retractable leashes are ok, as long as they are set at 6 feet. Again that's for safety. It could be dangerous to someone walking who does not see the leash and could be injured. "When an animal is about 20 feet in front of you, you don't have much control over it" "You should be in control of your pet at all times in any given situation"

Sharing the beach with your dog is a great thrill but first and foremost is keeping your pet safe in the heat and brilliant sunshine. When it comes to making sure pets are not in distress, Angela says Animal Services will be keeping close watch on all pups on Dog Beach. Sometimes pet parents may not recognize the signs of distress. "We want to make sure your pet is not put in a position where it's seeking help. It might be panting, it might be circling, and we are not paying attention to that. We might think it's a nice, beautiful day, but an all black senior dog might be getting overheated". "Our animal control officers can mandate care. That could be you leave and take your animal to an emergency veterinarian or they can give care themselves." Angela once again emphasizes, "We are here to help."

An Interview with Angela Miedema Volusia County Animal Services Director (con't)

Angela wasted no time in sharing her passion for safety by offering but is a "true angel" and absolutely adored by her pet mom. Sky important reminders.

Having plenty of water is an absolute necessity and a bowl to drink it from. Angela wants all pet parents to know there are several water stations on Dog Beach, each equipped with a bowl if you need one.

Be mindful of the time of day of your beach visit. Make sure there is plenty of room under your umbrella or bring another just for them for shade. Also, darker colored dogs are more likely to overheat because their fur absorbs more heat than lighter colored dogs.

If walking on the hot sand is uncomfortable for you in bare feet, "it's too hot for their paws". Try pet footwear or just keep them off the sand whenever you can.

Senior dogs and some breeds including "Brachycephalic" (or smoosh nosed/faced breeds, Pugs, French and English Bulldogs and Boston Terriers to name a few) are more prone to heat exhaustion and can have difficulty breathing.

Another thing many pet parents might not know is, yes, there are sunscreens for dogs. You might think their fur keeps them safe but, just like humans, there are areas that need special attention. The nose for instance, or many they have patchy skin that is exposed. Again certain breeds are also more vulnerable such as the Chinese Crested which does not have a lot of fur.

Be aware of the ocean and your pet. Riptides can impact even the It was a pleasure getting to spend time with Angela and Sky. best swimmers, two legged or four legged.

Angela says her 14 year old dog Sky, who sat at her feet patiently waiting during our chat, enjoys biting at the waves as they come in but, "drinking too much of the salt water can make them very sick and disturb the digestive system".

Sky came to Florida with Angela from Michigan. According to her DNA test, Sky is a "true mutt" with a mix of 14 different breeds

has lymphoma and Angela is helping Sky enjoy what may be her last year here, on the beach.

"We all want to be responsible, we all want to enjoy it out here. We all want to make sure the pilot program is successful and that means all of us doing our part and making sure it's all equal, so we take care of our pets, take care of our people, and make sure everyone has a beautiful day."
