


New Board Member














Daytona Dog Beach



In May of this year, Volusia County Council voted unanimously to consider a dog-friendly stretch of beach in Daytona Beach. They instructed county staff to work with our organization on this opportunity. We have worked with county staff to provide our input, which is rooted in extensive research and supported by experience hosting the dog-friendly beach in Ormond Beach since November 1, 2023. Our input took into account the following 6 factors: •



FACTORS

Distance

Number and location of Vehicle Access Ramps
Number and location of Park Volusia Off Beach Parking Spaces
Availability of Dog-Friendly Accommodations
Access to our Volunteer Support
Number and location of Pedestrian Access Points

We offered 4 various options for consideration along with a rating based on the factors.

We have committed to pay for all required doggie bag dispensers and annual supply of dog waste bags. We also committed to maintaining the beach with our Paw Ambassador volunteers.

DAYTONA BEACH RESIDENT SUPPORT

2023 Petition for dog beach in Daytona Beach received 2301 signatures.
363 or 16% identified at being from Daytona Beach.
2025 Petition in Support of Ormond Dog Beach received 3,746 signatues.
600 or 16% identified as being from Daytona Beach.
The petition against dog beach recieved only 373 signatures,
even though it was created 2 months prior to ours and is still active today.
91% for dog beach, 9% against dog beach





From 11/1/2023 - 7/31/2025, our volunteers have collected 7,500 pounds of refuse from the shoreline along our Ormond dog-friendly beach.

When combined with the 1,270 pounds gathered during the People & Paws monthly beach cleanups and the 230 pounds amassed at the Jimmy Buffet Day Beach Clean-up, a grand total of 9,000 pounds of litter has been banished from our beloved beaches since July 2021.

Our Paw Ambassadors and their pups are looking forward to walking the beaches together, cleaning up the new dog-friendly beach in Daytona. They have fingers and paws crossed it is approved.



Logan: A Gentle Soul Beneath the Sunrise

Logan's Road to Home

Some souls are destined to find their home—and Logan's was one of them. On a sweltering July day in 2024, fate gently nudged Cindy and Robert to leave an Anastasia Island camping trip early, head home, and make a Costco run on the way to stock up for the days they had planned to be gone. As they drove towards home from that unplanned shopping trip, traffic got messy. Five cars had stopped in the road ahead, and through the traffic, they glimpsed long, muddied legs moving from vehicle to vehicle. It was a dog—desperate, heat-stricken, searching.

Logan came straight to Cindy, as if he had been waiting for them all along. Strangers offered water and supplies. Robert rushed home to swap cars so they could get this gentle giant safely tucked into their truck. They reported him as FOUND, posted his image everywhere, waited for someone to claim him. But no one came.

Uncollared, unchipped, unneutered—but utterly perfect. On July 16, 2024, they officially adopted Logan. And from that moment, he settled in as if the house had always belonged to him, and they had always been his.

"We feel we were meant to find him," Cindy wrote. And Logan seemed to feel the same.

Sunrise Belonged to Logan

While most of the city still slept, Logan walked the shore. Cindy and Robert, devoted volunteers with Daytona Dog Beach Inc., made sunrise part of their rhythm—and Logan was always by their side.

The beach community came to know him. His calm presence, his eager heart, his way of greeting newcomers with unspoken kindness—it all made Logan a regular, a favorite, a gentle ambassador for everything Daytona Dog Beach stood for.

The Light in Logan's Eyes

On July 25th, Logan's journey came to an unexpected end. After seeming off for just a day, a vet visit showed nothing alarming—until the next day, when his eyes told a different story. An emergency visit revealed hemangiosarcoma of the spleen. The tumor had ruptured, and the internal bleeding left no path for recovery. Cindy and Robert made the hardest, most loving choice—to say goodbye while Logan's light was still shining.

He lived 380 days with them. Days full of joy, laughter, sunrise walks, silly grins, and quiet peace. Logan didn't just bring love—he *radiated* it. His capacity for affection was endless, embracing every pup, every person, and every moment.

And while they rescued him, Cindy and Robert say he rescued *them*—completely and without hesitation.

Logan's Legacy

Logan wasn't just a dog. He was a living reflection of Daytona Dog Beach's mission—a symbol of the powerful connection between people and their dogs, and the joy of sharing meaningful spaces.

From the moment he stepped onto the sand, Logan became part of our family. With Cindy and Robert by his side, his gentle nature and loyal presence reminded us why we work for dog-friendly beaches—so dogs like Logan can live their best days with the people who love them most.

Logan made one final trip to the beach. On August 5th, his vet called to say his ashes were ready to go home. Cindy and Robert left to pick him up immediately. Before taking Logan home, they visited the beach with him one more time. This time, a sunset. A goodbye. And when they left, the silence echoed. But his spirit lives in every sunrise, every tide, every tail wag that follows in his pawprints.

"Logan wasn't just a beloved companion—he was part of our Daytona Dog Beach family. His gentle soul, steady presence, and boundless love reflected everything we advocate for: the deep connection between dogs and their people, and the joy that flourishes when they can enjoy their favorite spaces together."

Spotlight on Sponsors

On the "Dog Friendly Section" of Ormond Beach and in the nearby parking areas and on entrance ramps there are "dog clean up bag stations" on most of the poles. On each station is a picture the sponsor of that station has selected. They range from business logos to pictures of supporters and their pups or just their pups. Two new sponsors are being added. Debi Coursey and Kim Sanders tell us why they are sponsoring bag stations.

Meet Debi & Robert Coursey!

After moving to Daytona Beach with her husband Robert, Debi Coursey would take their dogs Dutchie and Hollee for walks around their neighborhood, Rockefeller Gardens and Fortunato Park. When the first "Pup Rally" was held at Andy Romano Park to talk about interest for a "dog friendly section" on Ormond Beach, Debi was there. She and Dutchie became Paw Ambassadors, cleaning up the beach as often as they could.

Now fast forward through the trial period to full approval given this past April, the pair are very familiar to many who walk the beach in the morning, because they rarely miss a morning. "The "Dog Friendly Section" of Ormond Beach has been an incredible improvement for our community". And Debi explains, "has become an excellent sense of community in itself".

Debi calls Dutchie "my velcro dog because she follows me even German Shepherd/Labrador/Hound mix. Debi adds, "She may also be part pointer because she has learned to lead me to garbage which I might miss as we do our clean up." Dutchie is very social and loves meeting other dogs and people. She really enjoys the water and a good romp with pups she meets (even if it means getting all leashes tangled up!)

Dutchie has a big sister Hollee. Hollee is a boxer/lab mix with a "healthy dose of Mexican Street dog". She is almost 14 and her arthritis does not allow her to spend as much time at the beach but, Debi says, "when she

does come, she likes to hang out, meet other dogs and people, and let me know it's time to head home".

Debi says, "We have met a lot of people, some with and some without pups. We know all the dogs by name and some of the people. Dutchie and I have made some wonderful friends. If we don't see the people and dogs we normally see on a regular basis, we worry.

Becoming a sponsor of a bag station was important to Debi and Robert. It is not only a way to support this dog beach section, but it's a way to let all visitors know, volunteering is very important. Debi recently became a member of the Daytona Dog Beach, Inc. Board of Directors.

As the mission continues to grow, she hopes to spread the word of the beauty, fun and friendship found by putting "Paws in the Sand"!

Meet Kim Sanders!

Remembering Thor

"He was a gift from God and obviously He needed him back sooner than we wanted to let go". Kim Sanders shared many wonderful memories of her golden retriever Thor. Kim and her fiancee, Andrew Kucenas, had Thor in their lives not even two years when they had to say good bye to him on July 5, 2025, just 9 days after his second birthday. His diagnosis, idiopathic epilepsy.

When they picked Thor up at 8 weeks old on September 11th 2023, Kim remembers, "he made more of an imprint on my soul than I could ever imagine. He had the sweetest soul I've ever met." Thor was not a big fan of walks…at first but once he warmed up to them, most times they led to the dog friendly section of Ormond Beach!

Since they live only a few blocks away from the dog beach, he got to know every step of the route and to make the time last longer, sniffed everything along the way! Thor was not too sure about meeting the waves, at first but his "water loving "fish" of a sister" "Sunny" (an English Cream Golden Retriever) helped him grow to love the ocean. At home, he loved balls of every shape and size, especially squeaky balls. Kim says, "His favorite game was to hide a squeaky ball somewhere he couldn't reach, like under the kitchen sink or furniture, just so we'd have to get involved. Thor loved everyone he met and everyone he met loved him. "His bouncy, loving and innocent energy was impossible to resist".

Sunny, who has been missing Thor, now has a new younger brother to introduce to the waves. Kim and Andrew have welcomed "Huckleberry" into their lives", and like Thor, he is old enough to get out and about. This 6 week old bundle of puppy is full of wide eyed wonder and energy and Kim says "Thor opened my heart to having dogs in my life again, and because of him, I now have two wonderful pups to love."

Kim's reason to sponsor the bag station is two fold. First "to help support dog beach and to leave a piece of Thor here, so that when Sunny and our new boy, Huck visit, they'll have a place to stop and "see" him".

Kim also wants to raise awareness about K9 Epilepsy. "Some dogs can be managed with medication, but others, like Thor, can not, no matter how much you do. Despite working with a neurologist in Maitland, ER visits and other measures, his seizures remained uncontrollable."

Sunny and Huckleberry are now on the Dog friendly beach with Andrew and Kim who explains, "It's more than a place to bring your dog, It's a community where people and pets connect, support one another and share joyful moments by the sea."





Our mission continues to support endless adventures, happy People & Paws, and a welcoming environment for everyone.











Pets Best Insurance plans to join us as part of their company's 20th anniversary, which includes a group volunteer day.


Participants plan to wrap up the morning at Hard Rock Daytona for refreshments, snacks and prizes.
