PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:

Attendees of the Virginia Podiatric Medical Association's Summer Scientific Seminar will:

- Apply updated coding and billing practices, including 2025 E/M changes, modifier 25 use, and BMAD data analysis to
 optimize compliance and reimbursement.
- Review dermatological and nail pathologies commonly encountered in podiatric practice, and apply updated management techniques for optimal patient outcomes.
- The attendee will be exposed to common pathologies of the foot and ankle and the systemic medical conditions that may be associated with such pathologies.
- The attendee will become familiar with clinical and surgical management of the diabetic patient, including a
 multidisciplinary approach to limb salvage and Charcot reconstruction.
- The attendee will have an increased knowledge of treatment and management options of various traumatic injuries of the foot and ankle.
- The attendee will have an increased understanding of various deformities of the foot and ankle causing abnormalities and pain. Both conservative and surgical approaches will be discussed.
- The attendee will be exposed to ethical concerns regarding the practice of Podiatric medicine and surgery and opioid prescribing practices.
- The attendee will be exposed to complications of foot and ankle surgery and podiatric medical risk management.
