Real World Learning!

Samuel Johnson, Director of Community Partnerships, spoke to the Optimists on Tuesday morning about collaborations between the community and students concerning real-world learning. Previously, Mr. Johnson searched throughout the KC Metro area for businesses interested in partnering with schools to guide student teams through year-long projects.

With school districts across the metro now incorporating real-world learning into their programs, previous business partners are providing opportunities within their own districts. Clubs such as the Optimists are also offering new avenues for openended problems, generating opportunities for both high school and middle school students. For example, Ray-Pec Middle School students approached businesses along Highway 58 to request opportunities to shadow them. Students used cell phones to document their experiences and submitted presentations for assessment.

Real-world learning differs from traditional education. Some students participate in compensated educational experiences with enterprises at the LEAD center. Many anticipated a first paycheck of \$1,500 but received \$700, highlighting practical lessons about taxes, insurance, and investments. This experience contrasts with the educational backgrounds of many club members, who may not have learned about resume building, tax preparation, or applying academic learning to future work environments before graduation from High School.

Mr. Johnson invites any club member with an open-ended problem and an interest in collaborating with a student team to submit their idea to Denise Woolf, who will relay it to him. He is available to meet with prospective partners and assess their businesses to identify potential projects for students during this school year.
