This morning, members of the WEMO District gathered to hear from Brian Mills, Governor Designate for 2025–2026, as he unveiled a forward-thinking roadmap for the future of Optimism in our region. Zone Realignment for Stronger Connections

One of the most significant changes announced is the reorganization of WEMO's District Zones—from 15 zones down to 8. This strategic shift gives each Lt. Governor a broader territory but also opens the door for richer collaboration. By connecting more clubs within each zone, leaders can now share best practices more effectively, creating a stronger support network and fostering innovation across communities.

Farewell to the Achievements & Awards Program

After careful consideration, the Achievements and Awards program has been suspended. Of the 42 clubs in the WEMO District, only 7 were able to consistently participate in the demanding quarterly reporting process. For many smaller clubs, especially those with fewer than 10 members, the administrative burden proved too great. This change reflects a growing commitment to valuing impact over paperwork and making leadership roles more accessible.

Zooming Toward Better Communication

To support the new zone structure, Lt. Governors will now connect via Zoom—making it easier to stay in touch, share updates, and coordinate efforts without the need for travel. This digital shift is a win for efficiency and inclusiveness, especially for clubs spread across rural or remote areas.
