RPSINGS - The Choirs of RAYPEC

The Raymore-Peculiar High School program, RPSINGS, has become a model choral program in Missouri. Located in a suburb of Kansas City, RPSINGS is one of only five schools in the state to receive five Gold ratings in the Missouri State High School Activities Association Competition for the 2024–2025 school year. In the summer of 2023, RPSINGS toured France and was invited to perform in the Normandy Choral Festival under the direction of Dr. Cameron LaBarr. In 2022, the RPHS Chamber Singers were selected to perform at the Missouri Music Educators Conference, the first in their school's history. They have also performed alongside the University of Missouri–Kansas City Conservatory of Music and Dance at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts. For the past eight years, RPSINGS has built a level of excellence with 70 singers from RPSINGS receiving All-State Honors, the highest number in the state during that time. In addition to their work as singing musicians, members of RPSINGS have helped to develop and maintain a culture of collaboration and excellence that extends far beyond the rehearsal space through their promise as "a place to belong." Members of RPSINGS presented the RPSINGS Choir Leadership Council model at the 2023 Missouri Choral Directors Association Conference and it has helped develop leadership councils all over the country and as far away as Malaysia.
