Today, August 19, the Ray-Pec Optimist Club proudly recognized Sgt. Bill Talley of the Cass County Sheriff's Office for his dedication to honoring Missouri's fallen officers.

Sgt. Talley began his law enforcement journey in 2010, following his graduation from the Missouri Sheriff's Association Academy in 2009. Starting with jail duty, he quickly advanced to patrol officer, then corporal, and now serves as Commander of the Honor Guard, a role he's held for 14 of his 15 years in service.

As Funeral Assistance Team Commander, Sgt. Talley travels across Missouri to coordinate honors for officers who've made the ultimate sacrifice. He serves as a liaison—making initial contact with grieving families and agencies and overseeing every detail of the funeral process to ensure each tribute is carried out with respect.

His commitment to excellence began during his time in the U.S. Marine Corps Infantry, where he served in Washington, D.C. performing Honor Guard duties. That experience paved the way for his interview and eventual service with Cass County.

Sgt. Talley's leadership, empathy, and devotion to honoring the fallen reflect his commitment to public service. We are proud to celebrate his impact on our community and state.

Lt. Christine Eddleman accompanied Sgt Talley and gave members update of activities in the Sheriff's Department including another 8-week Citizen's Academy starting on Wednesdays in September. Members were invited to register and attend!
