MISSION: *A Healthy Lynnfield’s* mission is to empower residents to make positive choices every day. Together, we work to prevent substance misuse, to improve the quality of life for those impacted, and to support programs that help all young people thrive.





Strengthen community collaboration

- Partnering with the **Town of Lynnfield, Lynnfield Police Department, and Lynnfield Public Schools**, we posted signs encouraging parents to refrain from using alcohol or tobacco on athletic fields and in gyms.
- We held our first town-wide **Red Ribbon Week**, a national drug-use prevention campaign with **Lynnfield Pioneer Youth Football & Cheer** and **Lynnfield Public Schools**.
- With the **English Language Education Department**, we co-hosted a **Family Night** for multilingual learners, promoting welcoming environments and community connection.
- In collaboration with **MarketStreet Lynnfield**, 20,000 holiday coasters were distributed in restaurants reminding patrons to enjoy a non-alcoholic beverage before they get behind the wheel.



- To celebrate **National Recovery Month**, A Healthy Lynnfield joined forces with the **Think of Michael Foundation** to co-host A Night of Hope.
- With the **Wakefield Lynnfield Chamber of Commerce**, we co-hosted a 2nd annual **Healthy Living Expo**, showcasing health and wellness vendors and the much loved zumba group from **Lynnfield's Senior Center**.
- With **Lynnfield Public Library** and Lynnfield for Love, we presented a **SpeakOut Boston** discussion on the LGBTQ+ experience and how to best support inclusivity.

Reduce and prevent substance misuse through community change strategies



- A Healthy Lynnfield provided **Teen Mental Health First Aid** training to the region's **YMCA** staff.
- A Healthy Lynnfield's youth groups educated peers through a **New Year's Wellness Challenge** and monthly **"Restroom Reading"** flyers.
- David Jernigan, Ph.D. presented policy research on **"The Effects of Alcohol on Public Health and Safety"** to regional partners including elected and public safety officials.
- We launched the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's print and digital prevention campaign **"Talk. They Hear You."** aimed at helping parents prevent underage drinking.
- We offered **Lynnfield Public School** educators and coaches skill-building opportunities sponsoring training on suicide-prevention, managing anxiety, diversity, developmental relationships, and supporting LGBTQ+ youth.

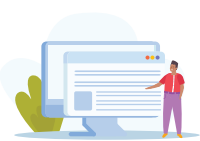
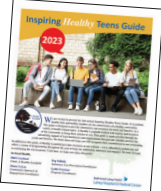
- A Healthy Lynnfield and the **Lynnfield Police Department** engaged businesses in our 2nd annual **Community Pledge to Prevent Underage Alcohol Sales**.



Support residents and improve their quality of life



- **500** coffee sleeves created by AHL Youth Council were distributed by **Christine's Café** promoting mental health services through the **Interface Help & Referral Line**.
- Over **7,000 copies** distributed of our 2nd Annual "Inspiring Healthy Teens" guide.



- **8,500** residents received a monthly article by coalition partners on substance misuse, stress, mental health, diversity, and prevention.
- **2-part** parent and caregiver discussion series on *Managing Childhood Anxiety* with **Riverside Community Care**.



- **400** "Making the Transition" guides were sent to the parents of incoming 5th and 9th grade students.
- **4-part education series "Healthy Conversations, Healthy Kids"** focused on (1) eating disorders, (2) screens & social skills, (3) youth alcohol & drug use, and (4) tobacco & vaping.



Nurture youth through opportunities for positive childhood experiences

- **AHL Youth Council** attended state-wide tobacco prevention **leadership training** and practiced **advocacy skills** with elected officials at the Massachusetts State House.



- **The AHL Club** at Lynnfield Middle School met monthly, **positively engaging** over 25 seventh and eighth grade students in a school-wide campaign during **National Mental Health Month**.
- We offered **student volunteer opportunities** at community events and assisted the Lynnfield High School sophomore class' Civics Action Projects. Civic engagement helps foster a sense of **belonging and connection** to community.

- We offered two 5-session afterschool programs for both middle and elementary students to build **social-emotional skills** through interactive programs like **Project Adventure** and **Be Well with SEL**.
- We **recognized** youth through scholarships from our 501(c)(3) and our annual youth leadership awards.
- Through **peer education**, AHL Youth Council **shared information, enhanced skills, and facilitated meaningful discussions** on substance misuse and related factors.
