A Healthy Lynnfield (AHL)





In an effort to promote a healthier and safer community, and in response to the rising misuse of opioids, The Town of Lynnfield formed The Lynnfield Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition, known as A Healthy Lynnfield (AHL).

Through coalition building, engagement of stakeholders, and implementation of proven best practices, municipal leaders in the Town of Lynnfield aim to reverse this crisis, save lives, and create a healthy, safe and thriving community. In May 2017, the Lynnfield Board of Selectman approved the formation of a committee to address the misuse of substances.

Today, A Healthy Lynnfield is an active community partnership and a 501(c)3 charitable organization working hard to prevent substance abuse and to ensure those impacted have the help they need.



What We Do

A Healthy Lynnfield engages town departments, residents, schools, parents, youth, the faith community, local government, businesses, civic organizations and health professionals in our work. Volunteers across the community are welcome to join our efforts.

Our mission is to empower residents to make positive choices every day. Together, we work to prevent substance misuse, improve the quality of life for those impacted, and to support programs that help all young people thrive.

Our efforts include:

- Substance misuse prevention education
- Coordinating activities across our partner organizations
- Enhancing opportunities for young people to lead on this issue through our LHS Youth Action Team
- Working with public safety to ensure lives are saved and referrals are made for treatment and family support
- Working with health care and behavioral health partners to ensure resources are accessible
- Reducing stigma associated with this disease

Lynnfield Public Schools

In partnership with the public schools, we work to review school-based health policy, implement social emotional supports for all students, provide education for parents on factors that put youth at risk for substance misuse, and teach integrated health and social emotional curriculum. These strategies help prevent early use and keep young people healthy.
