# I: Welcoming Remarks, Phil Crawford, Chair

Phil welcomed the coalition back to our first in-person meeting since March 2020!

### II: Guest Speakers, Justice Resource Institute

Matthew Peiken, LICSW Greater Lynn Area Director Children's Friend and Family Services, a Division of Justice Resource Institute

Matthew spoke about JRI and what his agency's services and experience with adolescent health since the pandemic started. JRI is one of the larger behavioral health providers in the north shore. Overall, the nation has seen an increase in substance use. It works in the short term but is not an effective or coping healthy strategy and it often comes with severe consequences. He mentioned that there has been a decrease in child abuse cases but that is only because there is less cases being reported due to the pandemic. Children were home more often during the pandemic without the support / trusted adults they have from being at school or other organized activities. Matthew also talked about building resiliency by making sure youth know they matter and helping show their purpose. "Let them laugh, let them have fun."
