- Explore the functions a future Human Relations Commission or similar structure could serve
- Clarify potential boundaries, limitations, and areas of responsibility
- Begin identifying role categories that may inform future governance and membership discussions



Time	Segment	Purpose	Detailed Activities
6:00–6:10	Welcome & Reflection on What We've Learned	Reconnect participants and ground the group in prior learning	Opening remarks from Dr. Amante-Jackson. Review key themes from previous meetings and reflect on what has emerged regarding community needs, concerns, strengths, and opportunities.
6:10–6:25	Community Needs Synthesis	Build shared understanding of priority needs	Present a summary of themes identified through prior discussions. Explore where there appears to be strongest alignment regarding community needs, concerns, and opportunities for support.
6:25–6:50	Small Group Discussion: "What Should a Future Structure Help Accomplish?"	Identify desired functions and outcomes	Discussion prompts: If Lynnfield creates a future Human Relations Commission or similar structure, what should it help the community accomplish? What responsibilities would be most valuable? What needs should it address? What outcomes would indicate success?
6:50–7:05	Whole Group Synthesis	Surface areas of alignment and emerging priorities	Share themes from small groups. Organize ideas into emerging categories such as education, dialogue, relationship-building, community support, advisory functions, communication, policy review, and community engagement.
7:05–7:15	Exploring Roles, Responsibilities & Boundaries	Clarify scope and expectations	Discuss what a future structure could reasonably be expected to do and what responsibilities may belong elsewhere. Explore potential areas of focus, influence, partnership, and limitation.
7:15–7:20	Looking Ahead: Preparing for Design Conversations	Connect current discussion to future phases	Discuss how identified functions and priorities will inform future conversations about governance, membership, representation, and operational design. Preview upcoming meeting topics.



7:20– 7:30	Public Participation	Invite community voice and reflection	Comments, questions, and concerns not addressed during discussion.
