Winnebago County State's Attorney J. Hanley announces that after a guilty plea, the Honorable Judge Jennifer Clifford sentenced **Timothy J. Glass, Jr. (DOB: 7/29/1965)** to 7 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections for the offense of Involuntary Servitude, a Class X Felony. Glass will also be on 18 months of mandatory supervised release upon his release from prison.

On October 5, 2024, Rockford Police met with an escort who reported she had been abused by the defendant, Timothy Glass, when she informed him a date had cancelled on her and he would not be paid for it. The defendant became angry when he learned he would not get paid for her date. They were in the bedroom of a residence on the city's southwest side when he grabbed a white cloth extension cord. He held the cord to create a loop and, despite her telling him to stop, he hit her multiple times across her body as he called her derogatory names. They went to another room where he told her, if she didn't get the date back, he would put the cord around her neck and throw her out the window. The defendant then struck her with the cord again. Officers observed multiple loop-shaped welts on the victim's body. The victim described the defendant as her boyfriend, and said there was a history of domestic violence in their relationship.

The Rockford Police Department conducted the investigation in this case. Assistant State's Attorney Alex Ronning handled the prosecution.
