PRESS RELEASE March 21, 2025 State's Attorney J. Hanley

Winnebago County State's Attorney J. Hanley announces that **Charles B. Hancock (DOB: 3/29/1974)** was found guilty of Predatory Criminal Sexual Assault and Aggravated Criminal Sexual Abuse after a jury trial before the Honorable Judge Debra Schafer.

On May 2, 2023, Winnebago County Sheriff's Police received a report that a child under the age of 13, had been sexually assaulted by the defendant, Charles Hancock. The assaults happened between June and December of 2022, while the defendant was residing in the same residence as the victim. Prior to his arrest for this offense, Hancock was a registered sex offender.

Predatory Criminal Sexual Assault is a Class X Felony and is punishable by a special sentence of 6-60 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections followed by a lifetime of Mandatory Supervised Release.

Aggravated Criminal Sexual Abuse is a Class 2 Felony that is punishable by a sentence of 3-14 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections followed by two years of Mandatory Supervised Release.

Hancock is scheduled to be back in court on May 2, 2025, before Judge Schafer in Courtroom 317 of the Winnebago County Courthouse.

The Winnebago County Sheriff's Department conducted the investigation in this case. Assistant State's Attorneys Emily Palmer and Andrew Marcum handled the prosecution.
