Winnebago County State's Attorney J. Hanley announces that on June 3, 2022, **Jason E. Randolph (D.O.B. 01/29/1976)** was sentenced to 10 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections for the offense of Home Invasion and 6 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections for two separate offenses of Domestic Battery after being convicted on June 17, 2020, after a jury trial in front of the Honorable Judge Jennifer Clifford.

On June 23, 2019, Rockford City Police Officers responded to a 911 call in reference to a welfare check in a home in Rockford. At the scene, officers located a female victim who had been tied up with cords and beaten. The victim reported that Jason Randolph had pushed his way into her home uninvited, forced her up the stairs, repeatedly struck her, and tied up her arms and legs with cords. The victim was able to call for help using her smart watch.

Home Invasion is a Class X Felony that is punishable by a sentence of 6-30 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections followed by 18 months of Mandatory Supervised Release. The defendant was sentenced 10 years for this offense.

Domestic Battery is a Class 4 Felony that is punishable by an extended term sentence of 1-6 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections followed by four years of Mandatory Supervised Release. The defendant was sentenced to 6 years on two separate offenses of Domestic Battery.

On June 3, 2022, **Jason E. Randolph (D.O.B. 01/29/1976)** was also sentenced to a consecutive 5 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections for the offense of Aggravated Domestic Battery after pleading guilty on May 29, 2020 in front of the Honorable Judge Jennifer Clifford.

Aggravated Domestic Battery is a Class 2 Felony that is punishable by 3-7 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections to be served at 85% followed by four years of Mandatory

Supervised Release. The defendant was sentenced to 5 years on this offense to be served consecutive to his other sentence.

The cases are scheduled for Status on June 17, 2022 at 3:00pm in courtroom A of the Winnebago County Justice Center in front of the Honorable Judge Jennifer Clifford.

The Rockford Police Department conducted the investigation in this case. Assistant State's Attorney Theodora Anderson handled the prosecution.
