Winnebago County State's Attorney J. Hanley announces that the Honorable Judge Ronald White sentenced **Jacklynn M. Brent (DOB: 10/16/2002)** to six years in the Illinois Department of Corrections for a Class X Felony of Delivery of a Controlled Substance. The sentence was part of a negotiated plea to the offense. Brent will also be on mandatory supervised release for 18 months after she is released from prison.

In November of 2025, Illinois State Police conducted a narcotics investigation at a residence in the 1100 block of Ridge Avenue. During the investigation, police observed the defendant, Jacklynn Brent, sell sandwich baggies containing a white powdery substance at least two times from the residence. Both times, the substances field tested positive as cocaine. Further testing by the Illinois State Police Crime Lab confirmed the almost 90 grams of collected substances during the investigation were cocaine.

Delivery of a Controlled Substance is a Class X Felony that is punishable by a sentence of 6-30 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections followed by 18 months of mandatory supervised release. Brent is eligible to serve this sentence at 50%.

The Illinois State Police conducted the investigation in this case. Assistant State's Attorney Stephan Gregorowicz handled the prosecution.

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
