Our village looks loved and tidy

Outwell Parish Council Magazine - Summer issue

You will no doubt have noticed that we have new railings alongside Well Creek.

You can't please everyone, but the majority of people have been supportive and are happy that it all looks tidy and a little more loved than it did before.

The old railings weren't repaired for years, and really made our lovely village look uncared for, so we have done our best to rectify that and it took a fair amount of time and a lot of work with the county council. If everyone who has an opinion would like to volunteer and work with us for the good of the village, then please step forward as there is still plenty to do.

Aside from the community orchard and memorial garden (page 4 & 5), we are still working to get safe crossings across at least one of the two busy main roads that run through the village.

With more homes, more people and therefore more cars, we need to make sure that people are safe crossing the A1122 (Downham Road)

and the A1101 (Littleport Road).

The volume of traffic means that we need a traffic-light controlled crossing on the A1122. A zebra-type wouldn't really be safe enough for either pedestrians or drivers.

The cost is huge. Really, really huge and there is no way the parish council can fund such a project as we don't have anything like the money.

What we can do, and have, done is work with the county council to come up with something that would work for us and highways.

As of this month, our A1122 crossing is in the top three list of priorities in the county. That doesn't mean a new crossing is imminent, but the county council agrees we need at least

one, and has also agreed to fund it.

The grey area is the timeframe - being in the top three is great, but we can't celebrate until work actually starts. And then we need to push for the other one across the A1101 to finish the job.

With the coming changes to local government and the loss of an entire tier of council, things are not completely clear in terms of grants, both in terms of availability and administration.

We will continue to look for pots of money made available that could be used for the village's benefit. Things do take time, but as a council, we are trying to ensure Outwell doesn't get left behind in any way.

Prettiest dog for Scruffts

An Outwell dog is heading for the big arena after qualifying to take part in a prestigious competition next year.

Zuri the rescue dog is a mixed breed from Kenya who had a rocky start to life but is now rubbing paws with the very best.

She will be going to Birmingham's NEC arena next year for the semi-finals of Scruffts - the special section of the world-famous dog show with a similar name, saved specially for non-pedigree pooches.

"She was found in a bush, starving and emaciated, injured and suffering from a life-threatening condition of African tick fever and thoroughly neglected," says Wendy Parks who adopted Zuri with her husband Phil.

"We are so proud that our little rescued street dog can hold her own

against other crossbreeds (all beautiful may I add) and, indeed, pedigree dogs.

Zuri is a Bajsenji crossed with breeds unknown, and can often be seen in the village on her daily walks 'strutting her stuff like the warrior queen she is," said Wendy.

She won her place in the semi-finals by taking the title of 'prettiest crossbreed' in a qualifying event held at Newark Showground in Lincolnshire.

Next she will take part in the semi-finals of Scruffts which is part of the Crufts event each year. There will be a total of 24 semifinalists who will all be vying



for the honours of top spot in the competition next March. If she wins then Zuri will take her place in the final which is also at Crufts next year.

Plans for a beautiful site

We are excited to show you the plan for the Old Rec community orchard and memorial garden

The project to transform the Old Rec on Robbs Chase is steaming ahead, even if it doesn't look like it at the moment!

We are mid-applications for grant funding to help fund the bits of the project that need outside help with, and we are also waiting to start connection for water to the site.

This spring has taught us one thing - we definitely need an on-site supply of water. We would never have guessed that once we planted the trees in March, it wouldn't rain again until May.

You may have noticed the IBC unit in the community orchard - we have had to water the young trees as there was nothing from the sky.

We have also been liaising with a company which has worked on similar projects and the plan on the opposite page is what we are aiming for.

The central seating area will have raised beds and the planting scheme will be more drought-tolerant than we initially considered.

The memorial garden will be encased within a beautiful pergola and roses can be planted along its length to remember a loved one. We are also hoping to have plaques fixed to the pergola with the details of the deceased. At this stage, nothing is fixed in stone so we are looking at costs, value for money and longevity.

We could go for cheap options on everything, but that would leave big items needing constant maintenance or renewal in under 20 years. Now while it won't affect us, it will be a problem we don't want to pass on. So we are looking to source decent materials which have a good lifespan and also look nice.

We want the memorial garden to be a lovely spot for residents to sit in beautiful surroundings, in the quiet of the garden and enjoy the blooming roses. It is the most important element in our plans and we want to get it right so it can be respectful and part of the wider community orchard.

The compass theme will run through the central area and pathways will be wheelchair-friendly. We also need to sort the gates and level out the road, so there is still a long way to go, but we will get there and hope to leave something the village is proud of and is much-used and loved by all residents in the area.

Old sluice can still be seen

Historian Bill Smith takes a closer look at the sluice where Rev Hardwicke lost his life

The sluice was originally constructed in c1775 and became a major part of the regulations governing the installation of sluices of this type.

The Sluice Bridge has recently been removed (April 2024) and a new footpath links the two major roads, A1101 and A1122 courtesy of Oakley Build and Design Norfolk.

Originally called a Penn sluice, it was constructed near the Wisbech Canal and Old Nene intersection opposite St. Andrew's Chapel in the late 18th century. The fully intact stonework is still in position and is just visible now the material used to fill it has subsided. Canal transportation ceased in 1922.

The sluice when operational was unguarded and has been the scene

of some tragedies over the years.

An Outwell clergyman the Rev. William Hardwicke who took up residence at the Rectory in 1813 fell into the sluice and drowned on his way home from a party at Beaupré Hall one dark evening in 1838. It was reported in the Star of the East newspaper that he was discovered in a "perpendicular position and he had not been robbed". The only thing missing was his hat; probably indicating he had entered the sluice head first.

An act of parliament was quickly passed making handrails mandatory over sluice and lock footbridges across the country.

There is a large commemorative tablet for the Rev Hardwicke embedded in the floor in St Clement's Church's east wing.



The parish council hopes that the remains of the sluice can be preserved as part of the village's heritage.

Launched in May, there is a new bus service available in Outwell which means you can travel to Chatteris or Wisbech every hour.

The Tiger 7 service (see timetable above) is operated by Stagecoach and uses existing and new bus stops in the village.

Run via the Cambridge and Peterborough Combined Authority, it only serves Cambridgeshire, and our zone is for the Wisbech to Chatteris service only. Check the full timetable and map online.

The Tiger also offers an 'on demand' system where you can pre-book a journey from anywhere within the zone Outwell falls in (Wisbech to Chatteris route, map online) and it's £2 a journey for adults or free

with a bus pass. They must be booked as the drivers cannot take a fare, and it runs from Monday to Saturday 6:30am to 7pm. For more information and to book call 01480 595440 between 6am and 7:30pm weekdays.

Major work for parish church

Investigations continue into the problems with the roof timbers and wood carvings in the church roof.

Once the full report is available, the Parochial Church Council will be applying for permission for an extensive survey of all the roof timbers which will allow for a full costing of all the required work.

There is no doubt that a major works project will be necessary. This will also involve discussions regarding how the building can be best used in the future. Community consultation will be a key part of this process.

For those readers who may not be

aware, the parish church is home to a set of unique medieval sculptures featuring the apostles depicted with demon-like characters, all ornately carved.

The wall post carvings were 'rediscovered' in 2012 during work by a Cambridge University historian, Dr Claire Daunton. A cherry-picker allowed a closer look and revealed the demonic characters apparently overcoming each of the apostles. But when seen close-up it appears that the larger, demonic figure, is weighed down by the roof, but is not part of the structure.

Some of the angel carvings in the roof have red wings and are clearly visible from the ground. There are also stone gargoyles to add to the treasures of the building.

The oldest part of the church dates from the 13th Century, but it



was built at various times between around 1350 and 1500.

The Friends undertook a huge fundraising project to see £60,000 spent on completing repairs, conservation and restoration of the windows in 2021. They had been in a bad way.





Wading through a plethora of trial transcripts, witness statements and old newspaper cuttings, the WI turned Old Bailey jurors investigated the double murder of the Reverend Elias Huelin and his devoted housekeeper, Miss Ann Boss. This startling, horrible tragedy shocked the Victorian community of Chelsea. Our thanks to Gary for sharing his stories. A good read for anyone who has already ploughed through every available murder from Agatha Christie and Wilkie Collins, or who fancies themselves as a modern day Sherlock Holmes! The lure of a grisly murder surprisingly still never fails to entertain, especially when it's true!

Tea on Tuesday fun

We all love a good natter, and whether it is about the weather, Wimbledon or the latest news on the economy it is always better discussed over a good cup of tea. No better place than Tea on Tuesday then!

I thought you may like a few little known facts all about tea – something to start an interesting discussion.

Here we go......

In 2005, the British jewellery chain Boodles created a tea bag encrusted with 280 diamonds to commemorate the 75th anniversary of tea giant PG Tips.

The bag, filled with Darjeeling tea, was sold for £7,500 at a charity event, and the proceeds went to the

Royal Manchester Children's Hospital, which was chosen by workers at PG Tips.

Before the Dynasty came to power in 1368 in China, tea leaves were compressed into bricks and used as a form of currency. The practice spread to Tibet, Mongolia, and even parts of Russia. was eventually superseded standardised currency in the form of coins.

It has been a very busy half term at Beaupré, as you will have seen if you follow our Facebook page Beaupre Community Primary School.

As part of our sustainability plan, we have also launched the Beaupré Sunflower Grow, with all children taking home sunflower seeds, compost and posts to grow and nurture. The children also have sponsor forms to use this as a fundraising opportunity for our wonderful outdoor area. We are also joining in with this in school, and have planted glass sunflowers

in the green space at the front of school, if you are passing by you should see them growing over the next term and hopefully many bees and other local wildlife will benefit from them too!

More exciting news was given to the children and parents in May, Beaupré are launching our new Opal play programme, enlisting the help of parents/carers, governors and the local community by asking for donations of unwanted items that can be re-used in school by the children. Opal, which stands for Outdoor Play and Learning, is a school improvement programme focused on enriching children's playtime experiences.
