Reading of the Scriptures

Hear the Word of the Lord:

Genesis 18:16-33

18 ¹⁶ Then the men set out from there, and they looked toward Sodom; and Abraham went with them to set them on their way. 17 The Lord said, "Shall I hide from Abraham what I am about to do, ¹⁸ seeing that Abraham shall become a great and mighty nation, and all the nations of the earth shall be blessed in him? 19 No, for I have chosen him, that he may charge his children and his household after him to keep the way of the Lord by doing righteousness and justice; so that the Lord may bring about for Abraham what he has promised him." 20 Then the Lord said, "How great is the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah and how very grave their sin! 21 I must go down and see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me; and if not, I will know." ²² So the men turned from there, and went toward Sodom, while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. ²³ Then Abraham came near and said, "Will you indeed sweep away the righteous with the wicked? ²⁴ Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city; will you then sweep away the place and not forgive it for the fifty righteous who are in it? ²⁵ Far be it from you to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! Far be that from you! Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?" ²⁶ And the Lord said, "If I find at Sodom fifty righteous in the city, I will forgive the whole place for their sake." ²⁷ Abraham answered, "Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord, I who am but dust and ashes. ²⁸ Suppose five of the fifty righteous are lacking? Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five?" And he said, "I will not destroy it if I find forty-five there." ²⁹ Again he spoke to him, "Suppose forty are found there." He answered, "For the sake of forty I will not do it." 30 Then he said, "Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak. Suppose thirty are found there." He answered, "I will not do it, if I find thirty there." ³¹ He said, "Let me take it upon myself to speak to the Lord. Suppose twenty are found there." He answered, "For the sake of twenty I will not destroy it." 32 Then he said, "Oh do not let the Lord be angry if I speak just once more. Suppose ten are found there." He answered, "For the sake of ten I will not destroy it." 33 And the Lord went his way, when he had finished speaking to Abraham; and Abraham returned to his place.

Colossians 2:6-23

2 ⁶ As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, ⁷ rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. ⁸ See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ. ⁹ For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, ¹⁰ and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. ¹¹ In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; ¹² when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. ¹³ And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, ¹⁴ erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵ He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it. ¹⁶ Therefore do not let anyone

condemn you in matters of food and drink or of observing festivals, new moons, or sabbaths. ¹⁷ These are only a shadow of what is to come, but the substance belongs to Christ. ¹⁸ Do not let anyone disqualify you, insisting on self-abasement and worship of angels, dwelling on visions, puffed up without cause by a human way of thinking, ¹⁹ and not holding fast to the head, from whom the whole body, nourished and held together by its ligaments and sinews, grows with a growth that is from God. ²⁰ If with Christ you died to the elemental spirits of the universe, why do you live as if you still belonged to the world? Why do you submit to regulations, ²¹ "Do not handle, Do not taste, Do not touch"? ²² All these regulations refer to things that perish with use; they are simply human commands and teachings. ²³ These have indeed an appearance of wisdom in promoting self-imposed piety, humility, and severe treatment of the body, but they are of no value in checking self-indulgence.

Luke 11:1-13

11 ¹ He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." ² He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. 3 Give us each day our daily bread. 4 And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial." 5 And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; ⁶ for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him.' 7 And he answers from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.' 8 I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs. 9 So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. 10 For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. 11 Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? 12 Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? 13 If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

This is the Word of the LORD.

Sermon The Eighth Sunday of Pentecost

As disciples of Christ, our service to the LORD is not just in our actions but also in our attitudes and attention. We must be in a state of mind and position to receive from the LORD all that the divine wills, to witness all that the LORD allows to happen in our midst, and have our hearts and motivations changed. The LORD is unique among all of the created order due to the desire of the divine to commune, converse, and connect with us. The LORD is not one who hoards everything and leaves us in absolute

mystery due to ego, but lays all the cards down on the table so we might make informed and better choices for our lives. Some mysteries do exist because of our limited viewpoint to see them in this side of eternity, but the desire to share is a key attribute of the divine for our betterment. Prayer is a key practice by which humanity has used to reach outside of ourselves and connect to the divine for as long as our species has existed. But prayer is more than just the language and words used, the rites and cultural practices lived, it is an attitude by which we recognize who is more capable than anything else in our lives. And act of turning away from what has failed us and receiving what is needed- even if our lives are disrupted in that delivery.

We see Jesus in Luke 11:1-13 teaching the disciples to pray, the words that we use for the Lord's Prayer even today. Immediately, we might see a discrepancy in what Jesus teaches. The words used do not seem to line up with how the prayer is used in our worship, or in how they are reported in the other gospels. What we have to remember is the one who is reporting: St. Luke- a Gentile believer who is writing an account for other Gentile believers with no Jewish understanding or background. The Christian community receiving this was coming from a background in which prayer and worship had a completely different understanding. A singular, all-powerful, all-knowing deity was an alien concept to them. Their prayer was not about connecting to the divine but appeasing it and honoring it, as if the gods were just like humans and had the same needs as us. That is why Jesus tells a parable about prayer alongside the prayer itself, to show that devotion and steadfastness were also key. Not because that was a guarantee one would get something, but to practice going before their creator again and being acquainted as a result. Just the act of going before the divine changes us and acts as a spotlight to everything else in our lives out of sync with that will.

That is how the story in Genesis 18:16-33 is shown, after Abraham has his meeting with the mysterious strangers who travel onward to the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah to prepare for their destruction. But earlier in Genesis, Abraham's nephew, Lot, and his family go to settle near those cities. It is out of fear for part of his clan, and knowledge of their righteousness, that Abraham petitions the LORD that anyone might be sparred from the wrath. Now it may appear that Abraham is trying to act like a used car salesman and haggle with the LORD, as some might have the habit of doing in prayer. But this idea of 'negotiating' is the old way of thinking that our efforts can somehow appease the divine, as if the LORD is just like us. But the LORD is not human, is not in need like we are, and is not as egotistical as we sometimes can be. Everything done is for our benefit and our change, to help us learn and grow out of old habits and embrace what is real. That is why the LORD acquiesces to Abraham's requests time after time. We know that Sodom and Gomorrah were eventually destroyed showing not even 10 righteous were in those cities. But that outcome communicates to Abraham that the practices, and promises, of those cities were not right to build faith on. The path that Abraham was on was one which would cause growth and fulfillment of promise, so this episode gives Abraham cause to keep going.

It is also what St. Paul writes in Colossians 2:6-23, which is meant to keep the church going in the faith of Christ. It is that encouragement and proclamation of Christ's defeat of every power and authority in this world, in their lives, which helps the believers to know what is trustworthy. Those who are advocating for the believers to order themselves in specific ways like circumcision, festivals, and other rites and rituals are stuck in the same old thinking of trying to appease the divine by human means. Those ones puff themselves up on the legalization of religion, which only helps their cause but not in the health and well-being of those others. Christ stands supreme above all that, opening the door to true realization and wisdom, and the knowledge that nothing in this world holds a monopoly on the gospel. It is good to dwell on what makes the best life, review philosophies and teachings, but not buy into everything they say. It is a call to consideration, to stop and check what these teachings and interpretations of other humans are saying and bring them before the LORD for verification. The LORD is truth and will reveal what is true divine will and not- but only if we come to him.

Prayer is a guarantee and a warning, a warning of what life will be like if we do not willingly come. People often give up on prayer because it does not give them what they want, but that is because they approach prayer the same way as approaching another human with higher power than oneself. There is no appeasement in prayer, no 'sucking up' to the boss, and no hiding anything as if we were smart enough to do so. It is about being in a space, a mindset, a position, by which we open the whole of our beings and be vulnerable before the creator. Nothing is going to surprise or shock the LORD, since he already knows who we are. The LORD is just waiting for us to recognize it out of what has already been revealed to us and then ask for clarification and what we truly need. Prayer is all about getting us back before the divine again, to set us before the divine character, and letting that presence be what drives our change. That disarms all attempts in this world by others to change and mold us, and even heals us of that damage by exposing us to what is true. Prayer makes us truer to who we are, and builds us into what we can become, but only if we let go of how the world has taught us and see the LORD as the LORD is: truth, guidance, grace, wisdom, and love for what we seek to accomplish and who we desire to be.

Help your people to accomplish this first and foremost and what it will cause your people to do.
