Reading of the Scriptures

Hear the Word of the Lord:

Genesis 15:1-21

15 1 After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." ² But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" ³ And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." 4 But the word of the Lord came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." 5 He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." 6 And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness. ⁷ Then he said to him, "I am the Lord who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." ⁸ But he said, "O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" ⁹ He said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." ¹⁰ He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. 11 And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away. 12 As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him. 13 Then the Lord said to Abram, "Know this for certain, that your offspring shall be aliens in a land that is not theirs, and shall be slaves there, and they shall be oppressed for four hundred years; 14 but I will bring judgment on the nation that they serve, and afterward they shall come out with great possessions. ¹⁵ As for yourself, you shall go to your ancestors in peace; you shall be buried in a good old age. ¹⁶ And they shall come back here in the fourth generation; for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet complete." 17 When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. 18 On that day the Lord made a covenant with Abram, saying, "To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates, 19 the land of the Kenites, the Kenizzites, the Kadmonites, ²⁰ the Hittites, the Perizzites, the Rephaim, ²¹ the Amorites, the Canaanites, the Girgashites, and the Jebusites."

Philippians 3:1-4:1

3 ¹ Finally, my brothers and sisters, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things to you is not troublesome to me, and for you it is a safeguard. ² Beware of the dogs, beware of the evil workers, beware of those who mutilate the flesh! ³ For it is we who are the circumcision, who worship in the Spirit of God and boast in Christ Jesus and have no confidence in the flesh— ⁴ even though I, too, have reason for confidence in the flesh. If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: ⁵ circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶ as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. ⁷ Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. ⁸ More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ ⁹ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based

on faith. 10 I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, 11 if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead. 12 Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. 13 Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus. 15 Let those of us then who are mature be of the same mind; and if you think differently about anything, this too God will reveal to you. ¹⁶ Only let us hold fast to what we have attained. ¹⁷ Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. 18 For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears. 19 Their end is destruction; their god is the belly; and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things. ²⁰ But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. 21 He will transform the body of our humiliation that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself. 4 1 Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved.

Luke 13:22-35

13 ²² Jesus went through one town and village after another, teaching as he made his way to Jerusalem. ²³ Someone asked him, "Lord, will only a few be saved?" He said to them, ²⁴ "Strive to enter through the narrow door; for many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able. ²⁵ When once the owner of the house has got up and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, 'Lord, open to us,' then in reply he will say to you, 'I do not know where you come from.' ²⁶ Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank with you, and you taught in our streets.' 27 But he will say, 'I do not know where you come from; go away from me, all you evildoers!' ²⁸ There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and you yourselves thrown out. ²⁹ Then people will come from east and west, from north and south, and will eat in the kingdom of God. 30 Indeed, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." 31 At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to him, "Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you." 32 He said to them, "Go and tell that fox for me, 'Listen, I am casting out demons and performing cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my work. 33 Yet today, tomorrow, and the next day I must be on my way, because it is impossible for a prophet to be killed outside of Jerusalem.' ³⁴ Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! ³⁵ See, your house is left to you. And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, 'Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord."

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God!

Sermon The Second Sunday of Lent

Jesus leading us with him to the cross is not just giving us a vision and discovery of what to expect but also what is around us as well. The shadow of the cross is meant to make us see everything in life much differently, because the LORD's salvation is restorative to who we were always meant to be. Our restored humanity makes us aware of what is around us, what we are holding onto, and if it serves any use in our day-to-day lives. Because we have the bad habit of picking up things we believe are essential and give us safety, but turn out to be garbage at best and harmful at the worst. It is the tendency that is within all people to worship the created rather than the creator and believe what appears powerful and capable. Jesus taking us by the hand and inviting us to join him is divine wisdom showing what is essential and what must be left behind.

In Luke 13:22-35 Jesus is traveling through the villages and towns on his way to Jerusalem, and during those travels pointed out the discrepancies between power that is healing and destructive. Society and culture would have been under the influence of the Romans, who brought in technologies and practices to that part of the world as a means of uniting their empire. The vast roads and highways connecting the world like never before for commerce and communication, but also to exercise military control. Jesus uses the image of the "door", which can also be translated as "gate"- as in the gate in a city wall.

The purpose of a city gate was to provide military security for a city against invasion, as well as to project wealth and civic status. For the Romans, they would have built a system of gates and fortifications into Jerusalem. A main gate which opened to the main avenue leading into the city, a wide highway able to accommodate a lot of foot traffic. But these wide and open gates also served another purpose, they were wide enough to accommodate a Roman legion marching in formation. It gave access to the city in the event of invasion or rebellion by the local populace. A smaller, "narrower", gate would have served civilian foot traffic into the city but was much harder to enter due to how small it was to block and delay enemy soldiers.

To Jesus, the wide and open gate represented a reliance on something else to serve life's needs which left one estranged from the LORD. The smaller and narrower gate did represent a way of inconvenience, of hardship, and eventual persecution. Choosing a way not based on power and control places one at a disadvantage as far as the world is concerned, but also confesses a reliance and recognition of a power the world does not see. Jesus laments Jerusalem choosing worldly power, and ignoring divine guidance, which is the eternal struggle of humans. But also looks forward to the day when people will recognize the way Jesus is taking as pointing out the fallacies in all worldly powers and how the LORD truly saves. About how to lead others back into true trust and communion with the LORD.

And the LORD has always been in the business of leading creation back from worship of itself and into communion and life with him. The journey of Abraham in Genesis 15:1-21 is the LORD exerting his sovereignty and control amid a world so wrapped up with itself. Abraham came from a world, a civilization, that was the most advanced of its time- as far as archeological evidence shows. Ur was the capital of the Samarian Empire, one of the first technologically advanced civilizations in that region. The Samarians developed complex social structures, writing, trade, and culture which allowed human life to flourish. It was estimated that approximately 65,000 people lived in Ur- an amazing feat as far as we are concerned! But it also possessed beliefs that were destructive to human life, such as the idea that barrenness and infertility were a curse from the gods. So a clan without an heir had no power or standing in the society. But the LORD led Abraham and his clan out of that world to show them a life available if they simply had trust in the right things. Meaning to let go of the convivences and power which appeared to give much but robbed others of the chance to enjoy the same peace and prosperity. Abraham's journey of trust would make him recognize a being willing to treat him as an equal, and even willing to set aside his own divinity for the change to demonstrate that way.

St. Paul in Philippians 3:1-4:1 writes to warn the church about the temptations to go back to beliefs and explanations which seemed to make sense, which promised security, but were also empty. The church in Philippi was confused by the conflicting teachings of the Jewish teachers who stressed the importance of circumcision and other human rituals to show their belonging to the covenant of the LORD. But St. Paul explains that belonging to the covenant has already been assured by the actions of Jesus, and the dogs (or vultures) circling them were not there for their benefit. These ones have been tempted by power and control, just like St. Paul was in his previous life which caused his own destruction. But while that past indicated what the LORD's salvation led him out of it also did not identify him anymore. Now was a way and manner by which St. Paul could live and work, and a hope which could give what worldly institutions and means could not. The way of Jesus is a way which transforms, redefines, and opens new opportunities to live better if we are willing to admit what all else lacks.

Going through the narrow door, the servants' entrance, the less-auspicious gate into the less glamorous parts of the city, will allow us to see what power and grandiosity have blinded us too. We fill our lives with the promises of others and hinge our beliefs on what others can do for us, only to be disappointed when the reality is revealed. All of us are creatures with limited ability, doing the best we have with what we have, and use power and control to compensate and bluff others for the sake of popularity. To reject that mentality is to free ourselves of control and manipulation, leave us open to unique possibilities, and make room to become who we were always meant to be and not as how someone else wants us.
