Hear the Word of the Lord:

Proverbs 8:1-36

8 1 Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice? 2 On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; 3 beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: 4 "To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live. ⁵ O simple ones, learn prudence; acquire intelligence, you who lack it. ⁶ Hear, for I will speak noble things, and from my lips will come what is right; ⁷ for my mouth will utter truth; wickedness is an abomination to my lips. ⁸ All the words of my mouth are righteous; there is nothing twisted or crooked in them. ⁹ They are all straight to one who understands and right to those who find knowledge. 10 Take my instruction instead of silver, and knowledge rather than choice gold; 11 for wisdom is better than jewels, and all that you may desire cannot compare with her. 12 I, wisdom, live with prudence, and I attain knowledge and discretion. 13 The fear of the Lord is hatred of evil. Pride and arrogance and the way of evil and perverted speech I hate. 14 I have good advice and sound wisdom; I have insight, I have strength. 15 By me kings reign, and rulers decree what is just; ¹⁶ by me rulers rule, and nobles, all who govern rightly. ¹⁷ I love those who love me, and those who seek me diligently find me. ¹⁸ Riches and honor are with me, enduring wealth and prosperity. ¹⁹ My fruit is better than gold, even fine gold, and my yield than choice silver. 20 I walk in the way of righteousness, along the paths of justice, ²¹ endowing with wealth those who love me. and filling their treasuries. ²² The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. 23 Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. ²⁴ When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. ²⁵ Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth—²⁶ when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. 27 When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, ²⁸ when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, ²⁹ when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, 30 then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, ³¹ rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race. ³² And now, my children, listen to me: happy are those who keep my ways. 33 Hear instruction and be wise, and do not neglect it. 34 Happy is the one who listens to me, watching daily at my gates, waiting beside my doors. ³⁵ For whoever finds me finds life and obtains favor

from the Lord; ³⁶ but those who miss me injure themselves; all who hate me love death."

Romans 5:1-11

5 ¹ Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³ And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵ and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. ⁶ For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. ¹ Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. ⁶ But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. ⁶ Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. ¹⁰ For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. ¹¹¹ But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

John 15:18-16:15

15 ¹⁸ "If the world hates you, be aware that it hated me before it hated you. ¹⁹ If you belonged to the world, the world would love you as its own. Because you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world—therefore the world hates you. ²⁰ Remember the word that I said to you, 'Servants are not greater than their master.' If they persecuted me, they will persecute you; if they kept my word, they will keep yours also. ²¹ But they will do all these things to you on account of my name, because they do not know him who sent me. 22 If I had not come and spoken to them, they would not have sin; but now they have no excuse for their sin. 23 Whoever hates me hates my Father also. ²⁴ If I had not done among them the works that no one else did, they would not have sin. But now they have seen and hated both me and my Father. 25 It was to fulfill the word that is written in their law, 'They hated me without a cause.' 26 When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. 27 You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning. 16 1 have said these things to you to keep you from stumbling. ² They will put you out of the synagogues. Indeed, an hour is coming when those who kill you will think that by doing so they are offering worship to God. ³ And they will do this because they have not known the Father or me. ⁴ But I have said these things to you so that when their hour comes you may remember that I told you about them. I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. ⁵ But now I am going to him who sent me; yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' ⁶ But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts. 7 Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you.

⁸ And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: ⁹ about sin, because they do not believe in me; ¹⁰ about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; ¹¹ about judgment, because the ruler of this world has been condemned. ¹² I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. ¹³ When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. ¹⁴ He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ¹⁵ All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God!

Sermon Trinity Sunday

At this point in the Christian year we take the opportunity to reflect on the nature and being of the LORD we worship. The Almighty Father whose promises in history, and with the Hebrew people, remind creation of its purpose and reason of existence. The gracious Son, Jesus Christ, who demonstrates the reality of the promises of the LORD in our lives. And the ever-present Holy Spirit who spurs us onward to carry those promises and realities to others around us. This is the triune God whom we worship and devote ourselves too and is a mystery of faith meant to always keep us humble.

Many have tried to articulate and explain the mystery of the Trinity by using various examples and metaphors to have it make sense to the human mind. Like the Trinity is similar to how water can exist as ice, vapor, and liquid while still being the same substance. Or like how the shamrock can have three leaves but is one plant. Good intentions have inspired Christians to articulate this belief so others can make sense of it, but is that what the Church should be doing? Is the LORD just a complex mathematical problem or riddle to 'figure out'? Is solving such a problem going to make us better at being loving, kind, and truthful to the complex situations and people in the world? Or is the Trinity there to demonstrate something else entirely for his people to pursue?

In Proverbs 8:1-36, we are given an example of what the LORD's good gifts are supposed to inspire with his people. Proverbs 8 uses metaphor and creative imagery to describe the concept of 'wisdom', which many assumed was just right knowledge of the divine. When Proverbs was written, the idea of monotheism was not as solid as we assume it to be today. There was the idea that there was a supreme chieftain god, and many lesser gods who served and catered to his whims in the world. These lesser gods were still powerful, still needed appeasement, but served also as messengers to the 'king of kings'. In this worldview, wisdom was seen as a goddess who served as advisor and consort to the chieftain god. She whispered advice into his ear which enabled the world to be shaped and ordered according to a certain will. But the teacher writing the Proverbs made it clear that wisdom was not a goddess, not a force or being independent of the LORD, but was created and represents the first order of creation.

Wisdom helps us to understand what it is that the LORD cherishes and prizes before anything else, and what he wishes to share with those yearning. Wisdom is a class of eternal knowledge which has existed since the beginning, and aids humans in going after what is right. It was not to be hoarded greedily or placed behind a curtain so only a few chosen can access. It is a force which confronts us in our daily lives, makes us look up, and consider what the LORD would want to see happen in that given moment. It was there to correct the people of the LORD, then and now, about what is real and worthy.

Jesus articulates that wisdom to the disciples in John 15:18-16:15 about what they could expect from pursuing it. Jesus reminds them that in what they are going after the world will hate them. Not because they have an idea or belief others do not, but because they are in relationship with one whom the world rejects. The world does not hate Christians, or hate the Church, but hate the one whom we represent. They hate the one who knows humanity for what it is, knows what it can do, and what must happen to get back into the right way- and it is easier to reject the truth teller than to change oneself. But that hatred, that scorn, that criticism is also a sign about the effects of the one we are listening too. Our witness, our wisdom, should be challenging and confrontational to those who hear and see it. The Church is there to remind all people in all situations, "Is this the best way to go?" The Spirit does not seek to dominate, control, or overpower, but remind what is truly right and what is accessible to being right again. That is why Jesus promises, "All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you." All that Jesus represents can become what we represent as well, if we are willing to embrace what the Spirit wishes to show us.

St. Paul builds upon this within Romans 5:1-11. Amid addressing the Roman church about what makes a fellowship, what is the plan of the LORD, and how to live into that plan that faith is the only thing which aids in that pursuit. It is not knowledge, ability, talent, resource, or anything superficial like that. Jesus has come to pour wisdom and reality into our hearts, to help us experience through our sufferings what is most important, to build us into people able to articulate that best way for others. The LORD does not have us suffer needlessly and does not challenge us just to demean our efforts. But to make us realize the power and authority which exists in all situations, positive and negative, which can help us learn what is best. That only comes when we open ourselves to the divine, see it as the best representation of what life can be, and then seek to implement it into all that we do. It is seeing the divine as something we are given access to step into and become apart of, a source of perfect unity and relationship, and the only way by which the promises of the LORD since ancient times can manifest.

Seen in this way, the Trinity is not an idea or concept. It is an experience to be lived, an invitation to be reciprocated, and a means we can experience the world differently than before. No longer do we have to see the divine as just another manifestation of

humanity which needs to be placated and bargained with, but a reality which makes us grow and see everything with new eyes. The only thing stopping some from experiencing its fulness is a willingness to accept the authority, direction, and charge had over our lives as a result. A willingness to admit our short sightedness, reject the false and half-promises of others, and embrace something totally new which cannot be counterfeited. Our celebration of the Trinity is the celebration of the newness of the LORD washing over our lives, the divine identity being pressed over our own, and the assurance that the divine will have its way over everything. So no matter what we do or where we go we can see opportunity for mission and renewal, and what the LORD desires first above anything else.

By these you pull us away from the false powers in our lives and enable us to recognize the true divine as it appears anywhere and everywhere.

But it is not just for our lives alone, but to be witnesses to help a world let go of old and destructive ways and embrace your truth and grace. In the lives of those we pray for, who are on our minds and hearts, help us to provide proper guidance and example so your truth may abound...*Reading of the Prayer List...*
