Reading of the Scriptures

Hear the Word of the Lord:

Isaiah 66:5-13

66 ⁵ Hear the word of the Lord, you who tremble at his word: Your own people who hate you and reject you for my name's sake have said, "Let the Lord be glorified, so that we may see your joy"; but it is they who shall be put to shame. 6 Listen, an uproar from the city! A voice from the temple! The voice of the Lord, dealing retribution to his enemies! ⁷ Before she was in labor she gave birth; before her pain came upon her she delivered a son. 8 Who has heard of such a thing? Who has seen such things? Shall a land be born in one day? Shall a nation be delivered in one moment? Yet as soon as Zion was in labor she delivered her children. ⁹ Shall I open the womb and not deliver? says the Lord; shall I, the one who delivers, shut the womb? says your God. 10 Rejoice with Jerusalem, and be glad for her, all you who love her; rejoice with her in joy, all you who mourn over her— 11 that you may nurse and be satisfied from her consoling breast; that you may drink deeply with delight from her glorious bosom. 12 For thus says the Lord: I will extend prosperity to her like a river, and the wealth of the nations like an overflowing stream; and you shall nurse and be carried on her arm, and dandled on her knees. 13 As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you; you shall be comforted in Jerusalem.

Galatians 6:1-18

6 ¹ My friends, if anyone is detected in a transgression, you who have received the Spirit should restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness. Take care that you yourselves are not tempted. ² Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. ³ For if those who are nothing think they are something, they deceive

themselves. ⁴ All must test their own work; then that work, rather than their neighbor's work, will become a cause for pride. ⁵ For all must carry their own loads. ⁶ Those who are taught the word must share in all good things with their teacher. 7 Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for you reap whatever you sow. 8 If you sow to your own flesh, you will reap corruption from the flesh; but if you sow to the Spirit, you will reap eternal life from the Spirit. 9 So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. 10 So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith. 11 See what large letters I make when I am writing in my own hand! 12 It is those who want to make a good showing in the flesh that try to compel you to be circumcised—only that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. 13 Even the circumcised do not themselves obey the law, but they want you to be circumcised so that they may boast about your flesh. ¹⁴ May I never boast of anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. ¹⁵ For neither circumcision nor uncircumcision is anything; but a new creation is everything! ¹⁶ As for those who will follow this rule—peace be upon them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God. ¹⁷ From now on, let no one make trouble for me; for I carry the marks of Jesus branded on my body. 18 May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brothers and sisters. Amen.

Luke 10:1-24

10 ¹ After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. ² He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. ³ Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. 4 Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. 5 Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' 6 And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. ⁷ Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. 8 Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; ⁹ cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' 10 But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, 11 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near.' 12 I tell you, on that day it will be more tolerable for Sodom than for that town. 13 Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the deeds of power done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. ¹⁴ But at the judgment it will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon than for you. ¹⁵ And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? No, you will be brought down to Hades. ¹⁶ Whoever listens to you listens to me, and whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me." ¹⁷ The seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!" 18 He said to them, "I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. 19 See, I have given you

authority to tread on snakes and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing will hurt you. ²⁰ Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven." ²¹ At that same hour Jesus rejoiced in the Holy Spirit and said, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. ²² All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows who the Son is except the Father, or who the Father is except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him." ²³ Then turning to the disciples, Jesus said to them privately, "Blessed are the eyes that see what you see! ²⁴ For I tell you that many prophets and kings desired to see what you see, but did not see it, and to hear what you hear, but did not hear it."

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God!

Sermon The Fifth Sunday of Pentecost

While I hesitate to bring together the worship of the LORD and national holidays, this year's Independence Day gives a chance to understand more deeply our Christian responsibilities. The United States of America is a nation which has done good for the world, and it has also engaged in activities which are seen as detrimental in the hindsight of history. America is a nation like another other in our world, a governing entity put in place by the LORD to help order creation and the divine plan for all. But it is that governing aspect which seems to have polarized so many, setting citizens and families against one another over what is considered 'right' and 'best'. So many are so obsessed with being right and triumphing over the opposition. Going so far as to set some on high pedestals just for the sick pleasure of knocking them off. So much has become about ideology, ideas, rather than focusing on the people who are impacted by those ideas.

In Galatians 6:1-18, St. Paul finishes his letter detailing that those who ascribe religious practice and dogma over anything else are not doing so out of love. The ones who are forcing new believers to adhere to circumcision are ignoring the burden and confusion being made over Christ's gospel, and his place in their lives. St. Paul was clear that the marks he earned on his body because of persecution are the clearest sign of his commitment to the Church in Galatia. In that same Spirit the saints of the church are to work at caring and being committed to others. To seek peace and harmony, look for ways to build up the week, humble the proud, and ensure that all actions are centered around the work and example of Christ. Because Christ was present first before any apostle or so-called teachers arrived and would be the one to keep the saints on track.

That is what the prophet writes in Isaiah 66:5-13, as that testament of promise ends speaking with those who are in exile. Away from Israel, and in Babylon, the LORD's people needed an understanding of how to serve the LORD in an effective way in that new place. By Israel's example, by their history, and their willingness they will become a source of inspiration and provision to a people who are watching them. A signal that

something has happened and meant to grab their attention. To show who truly makes the nations and charges its peoples with purpose, identity, and understanding. That is an attitude which would allow them to be of service, to appeal to those who look at them, and engage with the issues those on the outside might be facing. Not to become hermits or recluses just to keep what they have, but to realize what others need to see for their lives to mean anything.

That is why Jesus, in Luke 10:1-24, sends out his followers in a very specific way. The number '70' is symbolic because in the Hebrew mindset there were 70 different people groups which made up the known world. Jesus sends out his disciples to appeal not just to one part of creation, but to the whole. Disciples were to go out not in expectation they would be rewarded or privileged in such a position, but that they can represent to those who might never heard of the LORD's promises before. Those who might have the faintest idea about the LORD, but no clue how to live under or return to him. Disciples were not to be for-profit teachers trying to milk their living through flashy and popular means. But those who purposefully hunker down and live with others so they might understand the truth and reality about the one they live for. That the point is not the use the powers of the Spirit just to serve and make better ourselves, but to give assurance the creator has heard the cries of world and sent his own to assure them.

If America truly claims to be a Christian nation, then the way to prove it is not by flashy teachings or shock-and-awe. It is by identifying the issues that plague people's lives, engaging with others as they are, to find solutions which benefit the many and not the few. It does not involve rolling up the draw bridge and condemning others to their fate, but trying to see how they can add meaningfully to the society and allow others to see more clearly than when they were not here. And if the Church truly claims to represent the LORD in all his fullness, then we cannot become too bogged down in 'proper' thinking and opinions. But engagement with how others see the LORD, understand the gospel of Jesus Christ, and what obstacles they have in terms of faith. Because only when we can nurture and strengthen faith with no strings attached is when the Great Commission can take its ultimate form. A movement where the Spirit guides all and does not depend on any enforcement by any power, when the temptation to classify others by arbitrary labels breaks, and we can see how to teach others a way of living that truly is about them and not what we can earn from them.

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

By Christ, with Christ, and for Christ we come to this table as a single fellowship. As members of the human race that we might glimpse what we can become and what you set us up to do. Through these revelations of love and grace may we see the plans you have for us, and how you wish us to serve as your disciples only.
