Pastor's Corner

As we prepare to enter the Lenten season, we prepare for a time of discovery, understanding and insight. We know this is a period where we prepare for Jesus' journey to the cross and the ultimate sign of redemption to all, and nothing should surprise us about that outcome. Yet when we encounter this event, the risen Lord, we are not the same people ever again. Something changes within us, resonates when close to these works, and pulls us into something which makes us see our purpose and lives differently. It is as if the LORD is pulling us toward something, something we have either ignored or were clueless about. Slowly but surely the LORD teaching us, and bringing us back to something we have wandered from due to distraction or misplaced priority.

Jesus himself prepares us for this time from his words in Luke 9:23-27:

"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will save it. What does it profit them if they gain the whole world, but lose or forfeit themselves? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words, of them the Son of Man will be ashamed when he comes in his glory and the glory of the Father and of the holy angels. But truly I tell you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God."

Perhaps we have come to see the cross as something overwhelming and difficult we must bear with if we are to be disciples. We must sacrifice, give up, and suffer to understand Christ's plight. But even if we give up and sacrifice, could we ever reach the level of suffering Christ did for the sake of the world? And perhaps taking up the cross does not just mean giving up but also taking on. Accepting teachings, works, or habits that will stretch us and help us to see the divine beyond our limited perspective. To challenge our existing beliefs so we might see the character and nature of the true LORD, one who is ever-present and ever-watchful over our lives and what they will become.

In this Lenten season we should not be anxious or worried about if what we are doing is pleasing to the LORD. It is a time to understand and step into what the LORD is already doing and set into motion, because everything Jesus experiences and demonstrates is for our benefit. To help us learn, grow, develop, and step out of what might be suffocating our lives to experience something better. Beyond our mere imaginations and leave us in awe at the Emmanuel ("God is with us") who has our back even when we are not aware. -Rev. Joe
