*E*ver wondered what really happens behind the scenes at the Parker Police Department? Registration is now open for the Parker Police Department's fall Citizens' Police Academy.

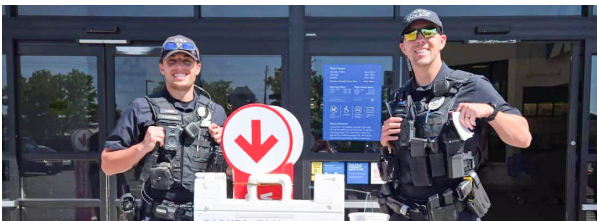
