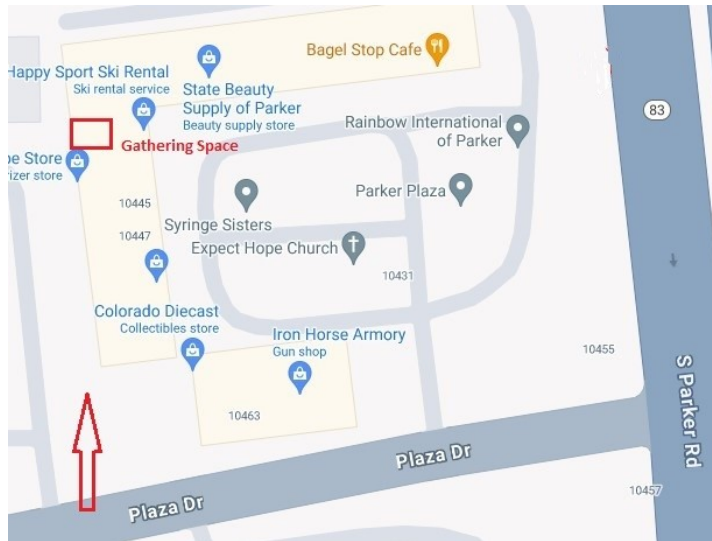


July 10 meeting: ELECTIONS & DA PRESENTATION

Elections for open positions will be held at the July 10 meeting. Brief job descriptions and terms are shown below. You'll see below that a few positions will only be for one year; terms are staggered to avoid all new board members in a single year. (Note: Secretary and Membership are not up for re-election this year.) We look forward to seeing you there and welcoming some new board members!

POSITION and TERM	BRIEF JOB DESCRIPTION
President (partial term ending 2025)	Preside over all meetings, meet with PPD and board to share and consult on needs of PPD, communicate with members as needed, represent COPPS at appropriate events/functions.
Vice President (2024-2026)	Assist the president as needed, meet with President and PPD as needed, participate at volunteer events
Secretary (current term ends 2025)	Maintain minutes of all general and board meetings, coordinate meeting locations for quarterly internal COPPS meetings.
Treasurer (2024-2026)	Ensure all obligations of COPPS are approved and paid and deposits are made in a timely manner, maintain financial records of COPPS and prepare monthly financial statements to board.
Director of Communications (partial term ending 2025)	Prepare regular communications with membership through monthly newsletter, updates on website, and periodic emails.
Director of Fundraising (2024-2026)	Prioritize fundraising needs. Coordinate fundraising campaigns and contact potential donors
Director of Membership (current term ends 2025)	Promote COPPS to Academy classes, recruit members, collect dues and applications, maintain list of active members, participate in volunteer events.
Director of Programs (partial term ending 2025)	Identify and arrange programs and training for the quarterly membership meetings (not at PPD)
Director of Volunteers (2024-2026)	Coordinate with PPD representative and COPPS membership to enlist volunteers for events.
