INTRODUCTION

Linda Solsbury, a 40 year old woman, has suffered a "locked-in" syndrome. In essence, her body has been "disconnected" from her mind. Cognitively and emotionally she has remained essentially unchanged from premorbid levels. Notorically, she is dysfunctional. She cannot walk, talk, swallow, or move anything but her head and right hand in a limited fashion. It is this minor physical capability that has enabled her to communicate by way of computer. Prone to urinary tract infections, spasms, and migraines, she requires a life time extensive rehabilitative network.

However she yearns to "normalize" her life in whatever way possible. She wants some feeling of productivity, social connectedness, and existential meaning.

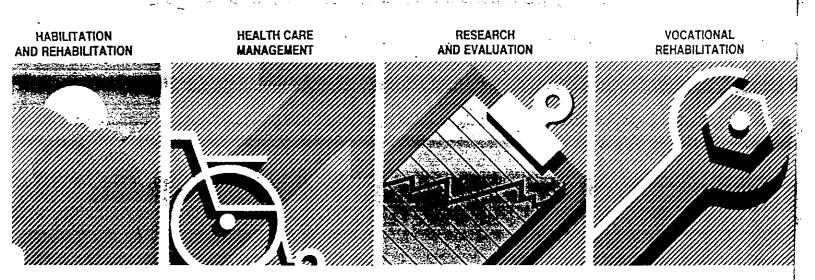
Following is the continuum of care that could help Linda achieve these goals.
