From the Pastor's Pen

Dear friends, sheltering in place,

We are certainly living through a challenging and changing time as God's beloved, aren't we? We have been rethinking how to be the Peace Church at worship and in service and fellowship. We have to practice being and doing these acts of discipleship in new ways in this time of social distancing.

Our Deacons and Elders and other church members are taking extra time to connect with the congregation. We want you to know you are not alone. We are still Peace Church. The building does not define us. The people - YOU - are the church! Think of this time as God's people being "deployed" into the world to do what you have been prepared to do as a disciple for a time such as this.

Help others to be more deeply connected to Christ through you. Reach out and share his love by staying connected to people. Call, email, or write to each other, to me, to your family, to your neighbors, whether you know them or not. Send an encouraging note or card. CONNECTION equals CARE. CARE equals LOVE. Love equals CHRIST. We are the church through our relationships with each other.

It doesn't look like we will be together for worship and fellowship during Holy Week, Easter Sunday and maybe for a few weeks beyond. We will keep communicating with you about those dates and changes as we follow the guidelines of our state and local authorities to help keep one another safe.

We have started using the online resources we have to stay connected and to celebrate worship. The Leadership Teams at Peace connects through weekly Zoom meetings (an online video and phone connection). I have Zoom meetings everyday with the committees and groups I am part of around the country. I use it for training I am taking. It is a great social connection resource.

Right now, our Sunday worship is pre-recoded and posted to our YouTube channel. We have a link to it on our Facebook page and Website. We also send out the link on Flocknote. This week we will do Facebook Live Prayer Services on Tuesday and Thursday and a live Wednesday Evening Vespers and Community Chat via Zoom. You can even join the Zoom service by phone if you don't use a computer.

We will also have a Maundy Thursday Prayer in the Parking Lot Communion Service. Everyone will stay in their cars and bring their own bread and juice with them. I will lead the service both on Facebook Live and with a speaker in the parking lot. Who would imagine this? Not me even a week ago.

For Palm Sunday, I am asking everyone to send me (peacepcpastor@gmail,com) a photo or video clip of you and your household "waving your palm" which could be a paper one you make or any branch, real or fake. I will then make a video using all these pictures and video clips and it will be our "Palm Sunday Processional" for our recorded Palm Sunday service.



Friends,

Even though we are not in worship together on Sunday mornings, our church needs you to still be faithful in your financial giving. Like you, the church must still pay reoccurring expenses like utilities, insurance, payroll, and taxes even though we are not meeting together. We are working to keep costs to a minimum.

We finished the first few months of the year ahead of budget, due primarily to several up-front annual contributions received and lower spending. In addition, we offset the per capita expense by another \$1,200 in March. Thank you!

The last part of March, going into April, will be our biggest challenge. With no in-person Sunday worship expected anytime soon, continued giving will be crucial to cover our monthly fixed expenses totaling \$20,000. The bill for the Fellowship Hall heating and cooling units (totaling \$20,500) will be due in April also, and although some restricted funds are available to help cover the cost, a portion may need to be funded from the current year's budget. The various ways to give are outlined below:

- 1. You can mail your check to the church. The mail is still being picked up and processed daily.
- 2. You can give on-line. We set-up an online giving option last fall through the Presbyterian Foundation. You can go to our secure web page and find the link to give online right on the front page. Just a couple of clicks and your offering is on its way to Peace. All these offerings are recorded and will be on your giving statement from Peace Church. The church pays a 2% fee for these online transactions. You might consider including that fee in your offering/gift.
- 3. You can have the church's bank make a monthly draft against your checking or savings account. We can mail a form to you to set up the process and you would then mail it back or scan the form and email it back directly to the treasurer at Peacetreasurer89@gmail.com


Fellowship Hall Heating and Cooling

As announced at the annual meeting, we knew we had to repair or replace one or two roof-top heating and cooling units over Fellowship Hall.
