From the Pastor's Pen: Giving Like Christ Gives

"Jesus went on through cities and villages, proclaiming and bringing the good news of the kingdom of God. The twelve were with him, as well as some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities: Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, and Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, and Susanna, and many others, who provided for them out of their resources." — Luke 8:1-3

When we think about our life as a believer, it's not about just having some beliefs we can talk about. It's not about fulfilling an obligation to go to church on Sunday's. It's not just about putting something in the offering plate or envelope. It's not about deciding if it's your turn to be a "volunteer" for some mission or task this week or this year and then being "done" and saying, "it's someone else's turn." Being a follower of Jesus means that we are so in love with Christ Jesus that we desire to be and do whatever we can to give our life to him every single day, to every role, to every task and service, to every person in need.

Giving like Christ gives means giving without end. It may change or be of a different intensity in this circumstance or season, but we never stop serving Christ as long as we love him. Your service is an expression of your love for the Lord. In serving him, you are doing what he commanded all who truly love him and who want to be near him. Jesus said: "A new commandment I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you also must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13)

Dr. Martin Luther King said, "...anybody can serve. You don't have to have a college degree to serve. You don't have to make your subject and verb agree to serve. You only need a heart full of grace. A soul generated by love." What do you have to give and use to serve Jesus? The only thing God asks us for is to love him with all of our heart, and soul, and mind, and strength, and to love others in this same way. Maybe we also have possessions and money and gifts and talents and time to give. But none of it will really be of any value to God and the work of the Kingdom without a heart and soul that loves Jesus and

longs to be near him and serve him all the time. Let us all, out of our love for him, ask: "How can I serve Jesus here at Peace Church? What more can I do for others?" Let us all say and pray, "Here I am Lord. I have heard you calling. I will go."

#### KEEPING YOU POSTED ON WORSHIP AND BUILDING USE AT PEACE

Currently, the following Session decisions on the re-opening of the church and in-person worship still stand:.

- 1, The Re-Opening Committee still meets on Tuesdays as needed to determine whether to have in-house worship the following Sunday. A decision to cancel in-house services (and the use of the building to medium and large groups) will be largely based on the Douglas County "Severe Risk of Covid Spread" dial. A composite measure of severity in the Moderate or Low range (0-2.0) will mean the church can re-open. <u>A composite measure of severity in the High or Severe range (2.0-4.0) will indicate the building should be or remain closed.</u> This RISK DIAL for our county can be seen at: <a href="https://www.douglascountyhealth.com/">https://www.douglascountyhealth.com/</a>
- 2. When we are able to hold in-house worship, we will do so in the sanctuary.

The Peace Church Annual Congregational Meeting was held following worship on January 31st. Listed below are items of importance and election results. Thanks to all who were able to attend and to those who helped make this special Zoom meeting possible.

## The Church By-Laws were amended as follows:

- 1. Reduce the number of elders on Session under Article III Elders, from twelve elders serving three year terms (maximum of six consecutive years) to eight elders serving two year terms (maximum of six consecutive years).
- 2. Reduce the number of trustees under Article IV Trustees, from six elders currently on session to three elders currently serving on session.
- Reduce the number of deacons under Article V Deacons, from nine deacons divided into three
  equal classes each serving three year terms (maximum of six consecutive years) to eight
  deacons divided into four equal classes serving two year terms (maximum of six consecutive
  years).






We are grateful to God for calling out these servants and to all in leadership for answering God's call to serve at Peace. These elected officials require your prayers


