From Pastor's Pen...

Returning to a New Normal- with thanksgiving, perseverance, and trusting faith.

"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." -Isaiah 43:19

How has your outlook and experience of life changed in the last couple or three months as we have been sheltering-in-place and living in this new kind of wilderness?

I had a pastor friend ask me this week if I thought people wanted to go back to the way things were — back to normal in their church life? I think, whether we want it or not, we have been changed, every one of us, our daily lives, our church life, our world has changed, life is still changing amid the Corona pandemic of 2020. I believe it will do so in many small personal ways as well as some large, far-reaching and impactful ways as we continue to be God's people in the world, today and beyond.

I read this in a recent blog that said: "A British survey of 4,343 people that was commissioned by the Royal Society of Arts, and the Food Foundation, The study found these interesting state of minds: <u>only 9% of</u> <u>Britons reported that they wanted life to return to "normal" once the pandemic lockdown is over</u>. That means over 90% are experiencing significant goodness and beauty; wanting to [live life in a new transformed way].

For many people the pandemic has been a wake-up call to things that really matter: over half of the respondents (54%) reported that they hope to make changes in their lives, and that they hope the entire country will learn positive things from the hard times. Others said that they were experiencing more gratitude – 42% of participants said they value food and other essentials more since the pandemic. More people are cooking (38%), spending less money (61%), and enjoying the experience of cleaner air (51%). About 40% of people reported a greater sense of community with family and friends. Matthew Taylor, chief executive of the RSA, said that while it was right that the immediate emergency was the priority, 'we must use this time to imagine a better future.'"

Our life in Christ, with the coming of his Spirit to us and in us, means we are a changed and changing people. That is a gift of grace from the Lord to you. What has changed in your life? What do you give thanks for? What has been revealed to you as things that really matter? What can you celebrate and lift up, by God's grace, out of the horror and loss from this terrible pandemic? What is (do you hope for) the new normal for your life?

Give thanks with a grateful heart. Lean on the promise, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). Live bravely into the fresh new wind of change that sweeps through our life by the power and presence of the Holy Spirit.



UPDATE of our COVID-19 Response at Peace

The Session decision regarding our response to Covid-19 to keep the church building closed until the end of June still stands.

We applied for and have received a Payroll Protection Plan Ioan. This will be used to fund salaries, utilities, and mortgage interest for the next few weeks. We expect the loan to be forgiven under the government guidelines.

The church staff continues to work from home and outside the church walls while the building is closed. Pastor Bonnie has created several options for on-line worship and fellowship. Many folks are taking advantage of these to stay connected. Work projects are being completed including property up-keep, building sanitation, church program planning and office maintenance. Mail is processed daily and finances are being managed by our Treasurer and Finance Committee. Thank you again for your continued financial support during these uncertain times. Shown below is our stewardship income through May compared to the total year budget. The unpledged income of \$13,970 is tracking about \$8,000 below budget through May, which will be difficult to make up in the balance of the year. We won't know for another month or so whether our PPP loan will be forgiven. We are closely monitoring our expenses to identify opportunities to offset this potential income shortfall, as well as a possible unbudgeted expense to replace the air conditioner for the church office.
