FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN...

This is a hope and promise we have felt stretched in believing for our church as we are almost a year from the day when we had to stop in-person meetings and worship. We have said and prayed, "How long, Lord?" We are almost there. The Session has set Sunday, March 21st, as the date we will resume in-person worship.

Sunday worship will be a hybrid service as we will still be using Zoom to engage and to broadcast to those not worshiping in the sanctuary. The service will be different than we were used to when we worshiped in the sanctuary before the pandemic. We will not yet have singing, most music will be on zoom, all must wear masks, and the congregation will be seated by ushers to observe appropriate social distancing. There will be no visiting in the building, but will be encouraged to take place outside.

As our congregation begins to resume this new way to do in-person worship, please know that we will do so with a careful, planned-out process that came through many months of discussion and discernment by the Reopening Team, Session and the staff. We will move forward with an abundance of caution and concern for those who are most vulnerable, with the consideration of all the best data and knowledge available to us in the moment, in the spirit of prayer, and with full trust in the grace of Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit. We are still the church; still faithful.

There will be changes and pivots along the way as we make mistakes and learn new ways and best practices. There will be grief, and disappointment, and frustration. But there will also be blessings. We will get to see glimpses of the new thing God is doing, even now. We will have opportunities to savor the spiritual gifts of love, joy, peace, generosity, and faithfulness as we live faithfully into God's future for Peace Presbyterian Church.

Let us be faithful to God and to one another as we work through challenges in this time of opportunities and new starts in our life as a congregation. We have a long history as Christ's church to this community and God is not done with us yet. May we be guided always by the Word, responsive to the Spirit, and open to the grace of God, remembering that nothing can separate us from the love of God through Jesus Christ, the one who lights the way and walks with us always.

SUNDAY MARCH 21 — RETURN TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP! from Pastor Bonnie and the Re-Opening Team

he Session has approved to resume in-house Sunday worship beginning March 21, 2021. Worship will be at 10:15 a.m. in the sanctuary. This will be a hybrid worship service. Worshipers and Pastor Bonnie in the sanctuary will be connected live with other worshipers and worship leaders and musicians online on Zoom. The in-house/zoom Sunday Worship Service will continue to be streamed to Facebook Live and a recording will be available on our church YouTube page. We are also looking at the possibility of live-streaming the worship service without the use of Zoom in the months to come

There are Session approved guidelines staff, volunteers, and worshipers in the sanctuary will to follow in order to maintain healthy interactions. These include requiring the wearing of masks, social distancing in the pews, as well as no congregational singing, no choir at this time, and no Fellowship or visiting in the building. These protocols are much like those we followed when we had worship in Fellowship Hall before the spike in the infection rate in our county. Rather than return to the Fellowship Hall, we feel the Sanctuary is now a manageable indoor space to resume in-house worship.

We will be sending out more information about in-house worship over the next few weeks, along with the guidelines. Please note that the building will only be open on a regular basis for Sunday morning worship. The office remains closed with staff working at home except for essential business. The use of the building by outside groups or for church meetings or gatherings is not yet approved. The Session will continue to monitor the health of the community and reopen the church for these kinds of gatherings when they determine it is safe and manageable to do so.

The Reopening Team and Session determined that several factors have combined that allow for the re-opening of the church for worship at this time. Specifically:

- · Reduced severity* Patients hospitalized with Covid-19 are less than half hospitalized last fall.
- · Younger age of positive cases* Less than 12% of all positive cases are for people over 65.
- · Positivity Rate* Positive tests have declined from a high of over 35% to less than 8%. Vaccinations
- Vaccines have been distributed to health care workers and senior care facilities. Those over 65 are now getting vaccinated.
