
Breakfast at the hotel.

- Gurudwara Bangla Sahib: Pilgrimage site linked to Guru Har Kishan Ji, visited by people of all faiths.
- Historical Sites:
- Humayun's Tomb: UNESCO World Heritage Site, precursor to the Taj Mahal.
- Qutub Minar: Tallest individual tower, built in 1199, part of Qutub complex.


Dehli > Agra

Designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the Taj Mahal symbolizes eternal love and is considered one of the finest examples of Mughal architecture.

Return to your hotel for breakfast.

Later visit Agra Fort.

The Agra Fort is one of the most important and robustly built strongholds of the Mughals, embellished with number of richly decorated buildings encompassing the imposing Mughal style of art and architecture. The fort contains a maze of buildings forming a small city within a city. The Agra Fort offers great views of the Taj Mahal from across the Yamuna.

Karauli is a historic city in Rajasthan, known for its rich heritage and stunning architecture, including the impressive Karauli Palace. Surrounded by picturesque hills and forests, it offers a glimpse into traditional Rajasthani culture, with vibrant markets and ancient temples that attract visitors seeking both history and spirituality.



Bhanwar Vilas Palace offers a captivating blend of history and design, featuring a stunning façade in the ancient town of Karauli and an eclectic mix of Oriental and Art Deco styles. Built in 1938, it serves as the family home of Maharaja Krishna Chandra Pal, the 181st descendant of Lord Krishna and head of the Yaduvanshi Rajputs. Unique for its original rooms filled with antique furniture, the palace provides an authentic heritage experience.

Lunch will be served in the hotel.

Enjoy a Horse Safari.

Bhanwar Vilas palace has its own stable of horses and operates short Horse Safaris to the nearby countryside.

Visit an Organic Farm.

Enjoy Heena Session in the hotel.

Karauli > Jaipur

The City Palace, located in the heart of the walled city, was the former residence of rulers and retains much historical charm with its winding streets and shops selling local handicrafts. Built in the 14th century, the palace features stunning murals, stone carvings, and lattice work, all meticulously restored. Notably, it houses the revered Madan Mohan ji temple, where the evening aarti ceremony offers a deeply moving experience.




Later, we travel by surface to Karauli.

Upon arrival in Karauli, transfer to hotel.

Staying at: Holiday Inn Jaipur

Enjoy visits to the City Palace and Observatory by Pink Tuk Tuk's/ E-Rickshaw (driven by women).

Jaipur, adorned with pink sandstone palaces, majestic forts, and lush gardens against the Aravalli hills, embodies India's rich heritage and urban sophistication. Founded in 1727 by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II, who shifted the capital from Amer, the city is known for its geometric precision and is one of India's most well-planned cities.





Karauli > Jaipur

Breakfast is at the hotel.

Later visit to Sanganer Village to experience textile techniques and practices of Jaipur.

Later, drive past magnificent Hawa Mahal (pictured on page 7) and walk through the old bazaar of Jaipur, popularly known as Bapu Bazar.

You may also buy traditional Sarees for Diwali celebration for tomorrow.



Enjoy special dinner in 1135 AD.

Located in the historic Amber Palace, 1135 AD restaurant offers diners a royal experience with an open-air courtyard, a formal dining room, and the opulent Sheesh Mahal, adorned with silver and gold. The restaurant specializes in recreating centuries-old royal recipes once guarded by palace cooks.



Amber Fort, located in Jaipur, is a stunning example of Rajput architecture, featuring impressive stonework, intricate carvings, and a picturesque setting overlooking the Maota Lake.

Stay overnight in the hotel.
