



Thaxted Festival celebrates Holst 150th anniversary with star studded line up: Nadine Benjamin, VOCES8, Iyad Sughayer, Zeb Soanes, London Mozart Players, Nash Ensemble and English Chamber Orchestra



Thaxted Festival announces its 2024 Festival from 21 June to 14 July 2024 celebrating the 150th anniversary of the birth of local composer Gustav Holst. The festival features soprano Nadine Benjamin, The Joanna Eden Band, The Nash Ensemble, and pianist Iyad Sughayer, alongside VOCES8, Mozart's The Magic Flute with Wild Arts, the English Chamber Orchestra, and The Festival's resident ensemble London Mozart Players. There will be a world premiere of Symphony No. 1 by Noah Max, who is composer in residence in 2024. The Festival has a partnership with the Young Classical Artists Trust and London Mozart Players to feature their musicians throughout the year.

Holst stumbled upon Thaxted on a walking tour of north Essex and was so enamoured with the village that he rented a house there from 1913 – it is where he began work on what subsequently became known as *The Planets*. Holst was fascinated by the planets and their astrological significance, and especially how this affected the lives of ordinary people.

Artistic director Andrew Jenkins commented,

"Thaxted Festival is indelibly linked to Gustav Holst, and this year we celebrate the 150th anniversary of his birth, with performances of his works throughout the





Festival. The highlight will be his First Choral Symphony with the English Chamber Orchestra and the Choir of King's College London, the same forces that memorably brought us Holst's Cloud Messenger in 2022."

With a whole evening inspired by Holst on 5 July, the Festival celebrates the life of the great English composer, whose lifelong friend Ralph Vaughan Williams was a great influence. On **Sunday 7 July**, the Choir of Kings College London will perform Holst's First Choral Symphony, a work that sets verses by John Keats in a traditional four-movement structure. Premiered at Leeds Town Hall in October 1925 by conductor Albert Coates and soprano Dorothy Silk, the work was initially well-received but fell into neglect, and today is rarely performed.



Thaxted Parish Church amidst the rolling Essex countryside near Saffron Walden has been described as the finest parish church in the country, and provides the perfect venue for the Thaxted Festival. With its origins in Holst's 1916 Gustav Whitsun **Festival**, Thaxted Festival attracts outstanding British and international musicians in genres ranging from orchestral, chamber and vocal music to jazz, folk, big-band and swing, from early music to contemporary styles and Holst is never overlooked. The area

is home to a number of writers and filmmakers and has a good working relationship with Saffron Hall to collaborate on orchestral concerts.

Festival Patron, Zeb Soanes commented, "Thaxted Festival has its origins in the music-making of Gustav Holst, whose 150th anniversary we will be celebrating next year. His Whitsuntide Festivals and other events brought together students, professionals [in] 'a feast' of music-making. Thaxted's new Developing Artists Programme continues Holst's passion and delight in developing young musicians. Providing a platform for musicians and composers at the earlier stages of their careers. On a summer's evening, there really is nowhere better to relax and enjoy the music of your choice in beautiful surroundings, than at the Thaxted Festival."

The 2024 Festival will feature events for younger audiences and educational projects with schools in collaboration with the **London Mozart Players**. The Festival has a Developing Artists Programme, supported by a dedicated Fund in partnership with YCAT (The Young Concert Artists Trust). It provides a platform for professional musicians and composers at the earliest stages of their careers, both within the main summer season and throughout the year.





Weekend One - 21 to 23 June



Opening the 2024 Festival with Holst's A Fugal Concerto No. 2, the London Mozart Players give the world premiere of composer-in-residence Noah Max's Symphony No. 1. This first weekend of the Festival also features soprano Nadine Benjamin performing Puccini, and a screening of *In the Bleak Midwinter* (2011), a film made about Holst's life and introduced by director Tony Palmer.

Weekend Two - 28 to 30 June

Folk duo Stevens and Pound open the second weekend of the Festival, and Nash Ensemble are set to perform some of chamber music's classics from Schubert and Beethoven, alongside Franz Berwald's Grand Septet in Bflat. Making a return to Thaxted this year, Wild Arts will perform their celebrated production of Mozart's well-loved classic *The Magic Flute*, in English.



Weekend Three – 5 to 7 July

Echo Ensemble, directed by Noah Max, opens the third weekend of the Festival with COSMOS: A Celebration of The Planets, featuring words and music around Holst and his most well-known work, all presented by Zeb Soanes, patron of the Festival. Rising star baritone Neil Balfour will perform an afternoon recital of Schumann's Frauen-Liebe und Leben with pianist Sholto Kynoch, alongside music by Puccini, Fauré and Holst. The same evening, Balfour will perform with the Armonico

Consort in **Purcell's Fairy Queen**: after its first performance in 1692 at the Queen's Theatre in London's Dorset Gardens the score was lost until the early 20th century. It was **republished in 1903 and given its modern revival by Holst in June 1911** at The Old Vic. The English Chamber Orchestra and the Choir of King's College London will close the third weekend with Holst's First Choral Symphony.





Weekend Four - 12 to 14 July



The final weekend of the 2024 Festival features **pianist Iyad Sughayer, who is joined by oboist Armand Djikoloum**. Sughayer has performed with leading orchestras, including the BBC Philharmonic, as well as in New York and Dubai.

In the composer's 150th anniversary year, VOCES8 perform music by Holst, alongside works by Giovanni Croce and contemporary American composer Caroline Shaw.

The strings of the London Mozart Players bring this year's Thaxted Festival to a close with **Elgar's String Serenade and Holst's St Paul's Suite**, followed by

Vaughan Williams' Tallis Fantasia scored for two string orchestras and quintet. Closing the programme is Dvorak's Serenade for Strings, a staple of the string repertoire.
