



Opal Lee's Annual Juneteenth Walk 2025 — Fort Worth, TX

On Thursday, June 19, 2025, Quinnie and hundreds of residents of Fort Worth's Cultural District families, local leaders, and community members—gathered at Farrington Field to participate in Opal Lee's Annual Walk for Freedom. The 2½-mile march honors the symbolic delay between the Emancipation Proclamation and the moment enslaved Texans finally heard the news of their freedom.

Though the 98-year-old Opal Lee, the "Grandmother of Juneteenth," was unable to lead this year due to a recent hospitalization, her granddaughter Dione Sims stepped in to guide the walk. The event drew roughly 2,000 participants, holding signs and balloons, walking in unity to carry on Lee's mission for freedom and remembrance.

Why It Matters

- Educational journey: The 2½-mile trek represents the two-and-a-half-year delay before emancipation reached Texas.
- Community solidarity: Families, elders, and youth walked side by side, affirming shared values of justice and reflection.
- Leadership legacy: Even absent, Lee's spirit and vision galvanized the crowd to walk in her stead.
