INWARD FACING PICOTS

1. Double stitch to the place for the picot.

2. Place stitch marker on shuttle thread as shown. Thread goes over the marker on the side closest to previous double stitches, then under the marker.


- 3. Turn stitch marker to the left for left handed tatters, and to the right for right handed tatters. It should look as in the photo, with the shuttle thread looping around the marker.
- 4. Draw the loop up snug against the previous double stitches as shown in the photo.
- 5. Continue tatting. Inward facing picot is formed. Leave the marker in until the picot needs to be joined with the tatted piece.


