

I arrived back on 3 dock just in time to catch Malcolm before he could cast off. I told him about the expected crew and he was fine with it so we waited a bit. But when 6:30 came and went without their arrival, we decided to head out.

Loose from the dock and passing by the boat launch we sifted through something on the bottom. But it was not until the dog leg in the channel that we were halted firmly, by a bank of silt. The motor revved but the shoal would not relent.

Is it Abacus? A Mirage 27? Anyway Brian Witty was coming out behind us. And we were hard aground. So when a helpful soul pulled up on the bank and jumped out of his truck shouting helpful instructions, it all got a little confusing. But once I recognized him to be Peter, I knew we were fortunate that he'd come along.

Peter suggested we hoist sails to heel the Northern over and reduce the draft. Malcolm was not immediately buying in. But we tried it. I was quite surprised when Blue Cloud still would not budge. We heaved a line to Peter and he pulled the bow around a bit, but more line was needed. Throwing it back and forth to the seawall, after adding some length with a sheet bend, a bit too much of the line got under us. Of course, it ended up wrapped on the screw.

Anyone who has done this knows what comes next. Someone was going to get wet. Before any of us could complain, Peter was down to his shorts and into the canal.

There is something a bit disconcerting about seeing someone walking across what is supposed to be a navigable body of water! That particularly when that water is only chest high.

After several dives I was reminded just how much Peter lived for this kind of boating adversity! A few more times under, and a cotter pin cut or two later, Peter had the shaft cleared. But we still had a 29 foot sloop sideways in the Channel!
