### **Moonlit Cruises**

Last season we had some great full moons! But not many boats made it out for them. And there are not always perfect conditions. The weather can interfere, or the moonrise can occur later in the night.

This year's full moons might allow for an interesting set of cruises. For example, May has a full moon on a Wednesday. So on Friday, May 28th a very nearly full moon will rise at midnight. Let's call that Moonlight Cruise #1.

Moonlight Cruise #2 on Friday, June 25th, is the night after the full moon and the moonrise should be around 22:30.

Moonlight Cruise #3 on Friday, July 23rd, is the night of the full moon and the moonrise should occur at about 22:00 hours.

Moonlight Cruise #4 on Friday, August 20th, is two nights before the full moon and the moonrise should occur at about 20:00 hours.

Moonlight Cruises #5 and #6 on back to back Fridays in September might interest some. The 17th with a moonrise at about 18:30 hours is 3 days before the full moon, and the 24th with a moonrise at about 21:20 is 4 days after the full moon.



In fact in '2021, one hundred and seventy seven years later, some of us and many others around the world are enjoying the race for the same £100 Cup awarded to their club's boat in '1851 England. Of course I'm writing about what is now know as the America's Cup.

So, on this 45th anniversary year of our club's formation back in '1976 let us work together to increase this club's greatness - if only just a little.

## Sail Racing

Here is a proposal for the schedule of series races. We can discuss and come to a consensus at the Spring AGM on April 24th.

I expect to donate a trophy to the club for the Single Handed series. This year for that series, twelve Tuesday nights are proposed June 15th through September 7th. July 13th might be a special Tuesday night with a festival of lights to celebrate the club's 45th anniversary. So there is no single handed race proposed for that night.

Last year Neil Watson won the trophy for the Thursday night series. This season, twelve Thursday nights are proposed as the team racing nights. June 17th through September 9th. There will be no race on July 1st as that will be a special Thursday night for those who wish to celebrate the country's 153rd birthday. Maybe some will take in fireworks at home. Others may be away to Cobourg for the Agar Cup Race. Also, The cruise East might have begun that day. There will be a race on July 8th. But some may be away then as well in preparation or travel for either the LO300/600 or the Eastern Yachting Circuit.

There is, as yet, no trophy for the Sunday Series. But this season I propose that we hold races on June 27th, July 18th, July 25th, August 8th, and August 22nd.

All three of those series are for white sail racing with PHRF(LO) handicaps applied.

## A Word on Reciprocity

One of the age old benefits of yacht club membership is reciprocity. Here is the theory. Our cruising members leave their slips empty while they cruise. Reciprocal club members cruising in can use empty club slips for free. Meanwhile our members similarly benefit from free berth in the clubs that they encounter along their way. This, provided that there is a reciprocal agreement in place with those clubs.

There was once a time when pretty much the entire lake was free to roam a couple nights at a time. We still get a few requests about reciprocals every year. Some come from other clubs, and some come from their cruisers. We also have various discussions with the more active cruisers within our own club every season. But reciprocity is not without its challenges these days.



There are some great big yacht clubs on the lake. And if you haven't noticed, we are quite tiny. So is our membership fee. Memberships in those big clubs are costly and sometimes come with debentures in the tens (or hundreds) of thousands. There is a reason some see dollar signs when you say yacht club. Along with many other advantages these wealthier clubs can keep a few extra berths for the times when not enough members are away. And they own their property. One thing about our club is that we don't own our spaces. Port of Newcastle obviously does. And I'd venture to say it has been many years since reciprocity was available to the members of the Port of Newcastle. Though I could be wrong.

Things are changing in numerous other ways too, ways that are probably not often considered! A couple clubs along the North East shore have closed in years gone by. There is now a big area between Whitby and Cobourg that is, in the words of the Sail Ontario, under served. That means many boats travelling between those places almost have to stop here (or in Darlington).

All that said, there may still be some creative work arounds to be discussed where reciprocity is concerned. But at least for this year we'll probably have to continue to be prepared to cover our own transient dock fees.
