






On pictures you post use a hashtag. Too often these great little tools are used as cuts jokes rather than their much more useful intent. Full of tips tonight, I'll give you another. Make it unique so you don't get mixed in with topics you had not intended.

For my boat I use <u>#Tanzer7point5theLeadingEdge</u>. I started doing this for my homesteads years ago and I like them so much I still do it today. You can find my latest pad featured with the hashtag <u>#BâchesBattantes</u>. I have one for my Jeep too. It is the same as my license plate <u>#UN40FIED</u>.

But I've digressed. Once you start using hashtags you could even ask others who have posted pictures of your boat to add the hashtag. This saves us all from the pesky trouble of e-mailing someone that great photo that you got of their boat.
