- The Masterplan includes elements such as Vision/Values, Objectives, Strengths & Weaknesses, Mission, Goals/Strategies, Action Plan, and Masterplan Creation.
- The founder of Got Advocacy, Tenika Combs, a special education advocate is dedicated to providing parents with the confidence to make beneficial decisions for their child's life.
- The workshop emphasizes the importance of preparation. Strategies are formulated to generate results that align with the vision and values for your child.
- The Masterplan is compared with Individualized Education Plan (IEP). While the Masterplan is a long-term strategy, the IEP addresses your child's present-day needs resulting from their disability.
- The workshop encourages parents to write vision and mission statements for their child's future in positive terms.
- Goals and objectives are set using the SMART (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, Timely) criteria.
- A SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) analysis is used to identify your child's characteristics, how they are operating in the current school setting, and how they are affected by external factors.
- Critical factors are identified as positive influences that help your child achieve the specific outcomes you want.
- The workshop promotes and encourages self-advocacy, providing strategies that help your child speak up for themselves and make responsible decisions.
