THE LORD'S SUPPER (Holy Communion)

Those who commune at the Table of the Lord are baptized Christians who have examined their lives and consciences. Christians believe and confess that in the Sacrament of the Altar all who commune receive, irrespective of their personal convictions, the true body and blood of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Those who do not receive in faith, receive thereby remission of sins, communion with Christ, and the pledge of eternal life. Those who do not receive in faith, eat and drink judgment upon themselves (1 Corinthians 11:29)". If you are not a member of this congregation or have never communed at His altar before, or hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, yet seek reception of the sacrament, please make yourself known to the Pastor prior to the beginning of the service. For further study, see Matthew 5:23, 18:15-35; 26:26-29; and 1 Cor. 11:17-34. (Note: If for medical or any other reason you prefer not to drink wine when you commune, the rose colored individual cups in the tray hold grape juice. Gluten Free wafer available upon request.)

"Prove it!" was the refrain of the onlookers, Jewish leaders, soldiers, and criminals. People today demand evidence too. And isn't there a part of us that wonders as well - especially when facing this sinful world? If Jesus is the Son of God, why does he __, or why doesn't he __? Maybe they're right. But Jesus' gracious words and actions turn our doubts to trust, as they did with one of the criminals (and later the centurion). Jesus asked "Why?" so that we could be sure. God even provided a little resurrection proof that Friday - a preview.

Procession of the Cross — As the cross is carried in procession, the following response is spoken three times.

P: Behold, the life-giving cross on which was hung the salvation of the world.

C: O Come, let us worship Him.

Opening Song — O Perfect Life of Love (vs 1-3) - LSB #452 O perfect life of love! All, all, is finished now, all that He left His throne above to do for us below.

No work is left undone of all the Father willed; His toil, His sorrows, one by one, The Scriptures have fulfilled.

No pain that we can share but He has felt its smart; All forms of human grief and care have pierced that tender heart.

Confession and Sins —

P: In the name of our God, to whom all hearts are open and from whom no secrets are hidden.

C: Amen. I confess that I am by nature sinful. I am guilty of many sins. I am distressed by the sins that trouble me. For all this I am sorry. I pray for forgiveness. Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love.

P: Jesus says to his people, "If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven." His death paid for the guilt of your sins and the sins of the whole world. Do you believe this? **C: Yes, I believe**.

P: By the authority of Christ, I forgive you your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (†) and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

Penitential Psalm — Lord Jesus, because your hands and feet were pierced for us, because you were surrounded by taunting enemies, and because you were abandoned even by your heavenly Father, we are rescued from the lion's mouth. Be with us when we must face our own crosses, and instill in us the confidence to say, "My Savior has won the victory for me." Amen.
