
Offering — In response to hearing the Good News, we take a moment of reflection to give thanks to God.

Those who commune at the Table of the Lord are baptized Christians who have examined their lives and consciences. Christians believe and confess that in the Sacrament of the Altar all who commune receive, irrespective of their personal convictions, the true body and blood of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Those who do not receive in faith, receive thereby indigment upon themselves (1 Corinthians 11:29)".
