THE LORD'S SUPPER (Holy Communion)

Those who commune at the Table of the Lord are baptized Christians who have examined their lives and consciences. Christians believe and confess that in the Sacrament of the Altar all who commune receive, irrespective of their personal convictions, the true body and blood of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Those who receive in faith, receive thereby remission of sins, communion with Christ, and the pledge of eternal life. Those who do not receive in faith, eat and drink judgment upon themselves (1 Corinthians 11:29)". If you are not a member of this congregation or have never communed at His altar before, or hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, yet seek reception of the sacrament, please make yourself known to the Pastor prior to the beginning of the service. 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

Opening Song — The Night Will Soon Be Ending (vs 1-2) - LSB #337

The night will soon be ending; The dawn cannot be far. Let songs of praise ascending now greet the morning star! All you whom darkness frightens with guilt or grief or pain, God's radiant star now brightens and bids you sing again.

The One whom angels tended comes near, a child, to serve; Thus God, the judge offended, bears all our sins deserve. The guilty need not cower, for God has reconciled through His redemptive power all those who trust this child.

Order of Confession and Forgiveness —

P: Let us confess our sins to God and ask his forgiveness.

C: Almighty God, so often we turn away from your Word and your holy will to follow our own desires and the temptations of the world around us. We fail to love others as we should. We have sinned against you in our thoughts, words and actions. Have mercy on us and forgive us.

P: God has had mercy on us. He sent his Son to be our Savior. In weakness the Son of God, Jesus our Lord, died on the cross for us. In power he rose from the dead in triumph over sin, death and the devil. I announce to you that your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: The message of the cross is the power of God for our salvation!

Almighty God, at the right time you sent your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, to be our Savior. Coming in power to save, our Lord was born in Bethlehem and laid in a humble manger. His mighty power was hidden in the weakness and suffering of his death on the cross and revealed in his triumphant resurrection. He has rescued us from sin, death and the devil. In the power of the Holy Spirit, lead us to follow Jesus and walk in his ways. Help us to be bold witnesses to his love and saving power so that others will come to know and worship him as Lord. Hear our prayer in Jesus' name. Amen.


Offering — In response to hearing the Good News, we take a moment of reflection to give thanks to God.
