I John Project - Purpose, Instructions and Helps

1. General Purpose

- a. The purpose of the I John Project is to assist people of all ages to memorize the entire book of I John in a calendar year. When looking at the 105 verses of I John it seems that memorizing the entire book would be a difficult task, and so we have simplified the process and made it a very reasonable project for people of most ages.
- b. Our website, <u>www.andsomeevangelists.com</u> is available for schedules, flash cards and other tools to assist people in achieving their goal to memorize the entire book

2. Instructions

- a. We have a weekly schedule available in a .PDF format that can be viewed, printed and downloaded from our website. This schedule provides 2 verses per week for memorization which is required to memorize the entire book in one year. We also have Flash Cards that can be downloaded and printed, that will provide a portable pocket-sized verse to assist in memorization.
 - i. Our flash cards are 2" x 3 ½" size, with 10 different weeks of verses on a single page. They are designed to be printed double sided so that you can see the reference on the front, and flip over to see the verses on the back.

- ii. Avery 5371 or the equivalent business card (perforated) paper is optimal for printing these cards. Each sheet will print 10 weeks of verses. The .PDF will also print on a standard 8 ½ x 11 sheet of paper which can then be trimmed to size.
- iii. Please consult the weekly schedule to find the corresponding flash card for that week.

3. Helps

- a. Tips for everyone (to be reiterated as needed)
 - i. Diction and pronunciation are important, so please make sure that the words are memorized and quoted correctly.
 - ii. Each word needs to be memorized correctly
 - 1. Additional or subtracted words in the verse do not count as a memorized verse and the correct order of words must be quoted to consider a verse to be memorized,
 - iii. Writing and hearing verses are reliable ways to help you learn.
 - 1. Record yourself saying each verse, and play it back throughout the day.
 - 2. Write each verse multiple times to assist with learning.
 - 3. Say the verse out loud as you read, and establish a rhythm in your speech.

b. Tips for churches

- i. Establish a person or multiple people to listen to others quote their verses each week.
- ii. Put the next weeks verses in the bulletin, on the overhead projector and posted in Sunday School Rooms and on bulletin boards, as a constant reminder.
- iii. Announce the I John project each service as a reminder.
- iv. Track the progress of each person that takes on the project as a challenge, and take note that it wouldn't be compromise to offer prizes (Especially to young people) to those that finish memorizing the book.
- v. Set a goal of an individual or several individuals quoting the entire book (whether in segments or in the whole) in front of the church.

c. Tips for families

- i. Mom, Dad, Grandparents and older children set an example by memorizing verses and keeping others accountable.
- ii. Help young children with pronunciations and set reasonable goals for them.
- iii. Offer rewards for well doing.
- iv. Use as part of a home school curriculum.
- v. Enjoy the time with the Lord each day.
