ABOUT US

An Overview

Friends of Lanka Incorporated has come a long way since its inception in 2019. What began in August of that year, with a group of Sri Lankans in Melbourne aiming to undertake humanitarian and community initiatives in Sri Lanka and Australia, has steadily grown in impact. Officially registered as an incorporated association, FOL was able to streamline its operations, enhancing both transparency and efficiency. Our flagship initiative, Help Learn, was launched in 2020, to provide essential school supplies to 210 underprivileged students from rural areas in Sri Lanka. Over the years, we've expanded this project, reaching more students by adding recipients to existing schools and extending our reach into new districts. It is truly rewarding to see that 1,722 students across six districts have now benefited from this program.

Friends of Lanka Inc. is committed to responsible stewardship of donor funds, ensuring transparency in all our operations.

Last year, FOL launched a project to provide laptops to three undergraduates who were in urgent need but lacked the financial means to acquire them. Building on its success, this year we expanded the project, providing laptops to five more undergraduates and a young person with a disability for helping him to pursue his studies and for securing an employment.

Additionally, to raise awareness about the Help Learn project and other FOL activities among people in outer suburbs, we organized our main fundraising event on a different model as a Koththu Drive. The event was a tremendous success, attracting strong community participation.

Objectives

The overarching aim of FOL is to carry out diverse programs focused on socio-cultural, economic, and environmental welfare to uplift communities in need and protect our planet. FOL undertakes various projects aligned with this mission, ensuring that donations are used effectively to support impactful initiatives and provide direct benefits to the communities most in need.

Program Structure

The FOL implements different projects under three main program areas



Help Enterprise is an initiative aimed at promoting the establishment of new small businesses in rural communities and providing ongoing support to help these enterprises grow and thrive.

Help Education is a project dedicated to supporting schoolchildren by facilitating access to education, enhancing facilities and resources, offering aid during critical situations, and fostering opportunities for vocational training and higher education.

Help Community & Environment is a multifaceted initiative encompassing various areas of focus, including environmental and wildlife conservation, disaster relief efforts, social transformation initiatives, as well as public welfare and civil rights awareness campaigns. This comprehensive project is committed to making a positive impact across these diverse domains.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT 30 JUNE 2024

Note 1 - Statement of significant accounting policies

1.1 Statement of compliance

The committee has determined that the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial report is a special purpose financial report which has been prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

1.2 Income tax

The organisation is a not-for-profit community service association and is exempted from income tax under section 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997

1.3 Revenue

Donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt

1.4 Goods and Services Tax

Surplus from the project related income

The organisation is a not-for-profit community association; the turnover of which is less than the threshold of \$150,000, therefore not registered for GST.

OUR PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

The economic pressures felt globally made it increasingly challenging for everyone to contribute to charitable causes. Rising living costs, housing affordability issues, and higher interest rates meant our donors had to prioritize essential expenses, impacting their capacity to donate. Despite this, Friends of Lanka Inc. succeeded in supporting a larger community mainly through its flagship project Help Learn. FOL continued with another trial run of its Sanitary Pad project for addressing the issue of high absenteeism amongst schoolgirls during their menstruation. Friends of Lanka inc. was capable to support a larger community thanks to the generosity of donors, well-wishers, and friends.

HELP LEARN

FOL strongly believes that children are our future, and every child, regardless of their economic background, should have fair and equal access to education. The HELP LEARN project was launched under the HELP EDUCATION program, aiming to prevent school dropouts in disadvantaged communities due to financial challenges. Through HELP LEARN, children from low-income families receive school stationery and other essentials required for each year to support with their continued education. Through the Help Learn program, FOL successfully supported 590 schoolchildren this year, including Muslim students from a primary school in the newly added district of Mannar.





Help Learn Program of FOL has promoted the multicultural inclusivity by extending its beneficiary groups to Sinhalese, Tamil and Muslim school children. The reusable sanitary pad project started last year as a pilot for addressing the high absenteeism amongst schoolgirls during their menstruation was trialed out another year. However this year instead of the imported reusable sanitary pads, Ran Liya Kulagana society were given an income generating avenue by making the pads for the school girls this year. The beneficiaries were increased to 100 schoolgirls and were selected from Galle, Anuradapura and Polonaruwa districts.

We conducted a Bunnings sausage sizzle in March 2024 to raise funds for the reusable sanitary pad project.

Ranliya Kulagana Society is a small, home-based enterprise led by a skilled group of women in Padaviya, a remote, resource-limited area of Anuradhapura. These hardworking women sustain themselves by producing items such as mosquito nets and school bags for a very limited market.

Through its HELP ENTERPRISE program, FOL continued its support of this local business by sourcing all school bag and pencil case requirements for the HELP LEARN program from them for another year. Additionally, in 2024, Ranliya Kulagana Society was given the opportunity to produce pads for the sanitary pads project under Help Learn.



For the 2024 HELP LEARN initiative, FOL purchased a total of 520 bags and pencil cases, including 230 fabric bags intended for students who had received school bags in previous years.

Help Earn

We are always diligent in selecting recipients for the Help Earn project, which focuses on supporting economically disadvantaged families with income-generating entrepreneurial opportunities. No beneficiary was recommended for this year by our coordinators hence not implemented. However, It was heartening to see last year's recipient make significant progress in her dairy business.

Koththu Drive

The major fundraising event of FOL the Food Fair was run on another different model as Koththu Drive this year and it was a great success. Through Koththu Drive FOL succeeded in approaching a segment of the community who do not generally come out to participate to our events thus managing to raise a larger public awareness of FOL activities through Koththu



Even though FOL is an organization with a small member base when an occasion arises it is heartening to see the

friends and wellwishers who turn up for the support as volunteers.

Koththu Drive was an event that needed meticulous planning where over 20,000 delivered

meals were cooked and doorsteps within a few hours. If it were not for the massive support from our big-hearted volunteers, this feat would not

Laptops are essential components of university education and most of the undergraduates who get selected from the disadvantaged communities to whom our Help Learn Program cater for

struggle to afford them. This year we provided laptops to five such deserving undergraduates and also a laptop to Anju a youth with a severe disability to pursue his studies with the course that he was following. FOL has helped Anju in the year 2021 for treating with his disability and it is heartwarming to see that he is on a path to build a career with a Graphic Design Course.
