
Objectives

3. OUR PROJECTS & ACTIVITIES

As in previous years, FOL continued to deliver its key educational and community support projects, alongside small-scale enterprise initiatives. While no major fundraising activities were conducted this year, the organisation efficiently utilised the remaining funds from previous years and member subscriptions to sustain and expand its core programs.

These included the *HelpLearn* project, the *Ranliya* enterprise initiative, and a few community engagement programs in Australia.

HelpLearn

For the fifth consecutive year, FOL supported schoolchildren in rural Sri Lanka by donating essential stationery and school supplies. In 2024/25, the *HelpLearn* project benefited **580 children from 66 schools** across **six districts**, as shown below.

A Significant Change in the HelpLearn Delivery Model

This year, the *HelpLearn* project underwent a major transformation. As the Sri Lankan Department of Education began assisting schools with the provision of learning materials, FOL identified a new and more impactful area of support, **developing children's English proficiency and life skills**.

Through consultations with local teachers and volunteers, FOL recognised that children in remote schools needed opportunities to enhance their confidence and communication skills to help open pathways to a brighter future.

In response, FOL launched English Language Learning Programs at:

- Kallanchiya Maha Vidyalaya in Anuradhapura District
- Woodlands Primary School, Gonapinuwala in Galle District

These programs are designed as **activity-based**, **fun-filled sessions** for primary-level students. Each program begins with opening day English camp, followed by **weekly two-hour sessions over four months** with closing day English Camp. The initial phase has been met with great enthusiasm from both students and teachers.





Help Earn

Under FOL's *Help Enterprise* initiative, the **Ranliya Kulagana Society** — a group of industrious mothers — continued to receive support for the fifth consecutive year. They were once again awarded the contract to produce school bags, providing much-needed income and empowerment for their families.

In 2024, FOL purchased:

- 520 school bags and pencil cases, including
- 230 fabric bags intended for students who had received bags in previous years.

This initiative continues to serve as an excellent model of sustainable community enterprise.





Additionally, FOL supported a **single mother with two children** by helping her purchase a **cow and calf**, enabling her to generate income to sustain her family and fund her children's education — a true reflection of FOL's commitment to uplifting lives

through meaningful assistance.





Blood Donation Event

FOL also continued its **annual blood donation drive** at the *Mount Waverley Australian Lifeblood Centre* in April. The event saw active participation from our members and supporters, reflecting the organisation's ongoing commitment to community welfare beyond borders.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to all who participated and helped make this event a success.





Donation of Laptops to deserving undergraduates

Eight laptop computers that were in almost new condition were also donated to three undergraduates from Sri Jayewardenepura University and Kelaniya University who could not afford to buy laptops, which were an essential component to their studies.


This is FOL's fifth completed financial year since its registration.

Note 1 - Statement of significant accounting policies

1.1 Statement of compliance

The committee has determined that the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial report is a special purpose financial report which has been prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

1.2 Income tax

The organisation is a not-for-profit community service association and is exempted from income tax under section 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997

1.3 Revenue

Donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt

1.4 Goods and Services Tax

The organisation is a not-for-profit community association; the turnover of which is less than the threshold of \$150,000, therefore not registered for GST.

strengthens our confidence that, together, we can help many more children from

disadvantaged communities take their first steps toward a brighter, more hopeful future.
