BIBLICAL TRUTHS

Genesis 6-9

"The Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually." (Genesis 6:5). "But Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord." (Genesis 6:8). Noah was 500 years old when he had three sons Shem, Ham, and Japheth. Shem was the heir to the promise. God instructed Noah to build an ark for himself out of gopher wood and pitch. It was to be 300 cubits long, 30 cubits high, and 50 cubits wide. It was to have a roof, a window, and a door on the side. It had rooms on three decks.

Adam was 130 years old when he had Seth; Seth was 105 years old when he had Enosh; Enosh was 90 years old when he had Kenan; Kenan was 70 years old when he had Mahalalel; Mahalalel was 65 years old when he had Jared; Jared was 162 years old when he had Enoch; Enoch was 65 years old when he had Methuselah; Methuselah was 187 years old when he had Lamech; and Lamech was 182 years old when he had Noah; Noah was 600 years old when the flood came. The earth was 1776 years old.

Noah loaded the Ark with 7 pairs of every clean animal and bird, and one pair of every unclean animal and bird with food for each kind. "Then the Lord said to Noah, 'Come into the ark, you and all your household, for I have seen that you are righteous before Me in this generation.' The Lord shut him in" (Genesis 7:1). Now the ark sat there for seven days. The number 7 means completeness. Then the rains came from the sky, from the reservoirs in the ground, and sideways as the wind blew. It rained for forty days and forty nights. The number 40 also means completeness. Every drop of moisture was on the surface of the earth. "The waters prevailed above the mountains, covering them fifteen cubits deep" (Genesis 7:20). Everyone who died in the faith before the flood will be saved eternally and those who were alive during the flood will be dammed eternally.

"At the end of 150 days the waters had abated, and in the seventh month, on the seventeenth day of the month, the ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat" (Genesis 8:3-4). At the end of forty days, Noah opened the window of the ark and sent out a raven which did not return. Then he sent out a dove which returned. He waited seven days and sent the dove out again and she returned with a freshly plucked olive leaf. He waited seven days and sent the dove out again but it did not return.

After releasing every living thing from the ark, Noah built an altar and made an offering of some clean animals and birds to God. (Genesis 8:20)

"And God blessed Noah and his sons and said to them, be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth" (Genesis 9:1).

"And God said, this is the sign of covenant that I make between Me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set My bow in the cloud, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between Me and the earth." (Genesis 9:11-13). God still loves and cares for His creation. What we call a rainbow in the sky when it rains is God's sign of His promise never again to destroy every living creature on the face of the earth. It was not the birds in the sky or the animals on and in the ground that provoked God's wrath but sinful man. God had had enough and only a remnant of people who were righteous in His sight were saved.

Define Your Life by How You Give

Winston Churchill reportedly said that "we make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give." According to Churchill, our lives are defined not by what we have gotten, but by what we give away.

Our Lord's life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God's Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. He died the death that we deserved for our sins. He gave of Himself in order to save us from sin, death and hell. And so it is that by giving completely of Himself, He got for Himself us, making us citizens of His eternal kingdom by grace.

As it was for Jesus, so it also is for us. We get more from giving than we do from simply getting. For giving softens our hearts and frees us from the grip which the worries of this world and making a living has on us. For when we are singularly focused on making a living, we are singularly focused on what we get. We become more selfish instead of selfless.

But when we give, we do not have less, we do not become less; rather, we have more and become more. When we give, we join in the bond of friendship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus, we are participating in the divine nature. As Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).
