# Mamakating Library goes 3D Printing education and opportunities to residents

WURTSBORO — Approximately 20 residents from elementary school age to senior citizens attended the 3D printing workshop at the Mamakating Library on June 30. The demonstration was conducted by Columbia University graduate student William Bodell.

Participants were given a history and overview of 3D printing before being instructed in CAD (computer aided drafting) basics, then creating their own object to be constructed with the printer.

"What interested me the most about 3D printing was learning about the potential impact on rural economic development for home-based manufacturing as well as being able to introduce this

technology to young children who may be able to discover additional uses for it," said Peggy Johansen, the Director of the Mamakating Library.

Johansen described the behind the scenes process involved to make the event happen. "This took about a year of planning. To acquire the 3D printer, we pooled funds with other Sullivan County libraries then collaborated to schedule training. We are hopeful the printer will be available at each library and it will be permanently housed at the Monticello Library."

The printer itself is relatively light and designed to be mobile. Therefore, items printed cannot be larger than 5 cubic inches. The material used to construct items is a plastic filament which is on spools. The action of the printer can be compared to that of a sewing machine if the needle motion was altered to lay the material down on itself rather than

going in and out of fabric.
"We are offering another class on Friday, July 8 from 6:30 - 8:30 p.m. The second workshop will be conducted by Thomas John Bosket and Isaac Green Diebboll of ENGN, which is a local educational organization for social, civic and creative investigation. The main focus will be around how 3D printing can include rural economy as well as the safety, freedom and legality of 3D printing. Information for this class by calling 845-888-8004," Johansen said.

Upon the conclusion of the event, Bodell said, "I think what surprised participants the most was the variety of applications for 3D printing.

From printing entire buildings out of concrete to working blood vessels made of living cells, the number of materials and methods is growing every day. So while printing plastic figurines can be a fun hobby, advances in the technology are creating new and profound ways for the process to improve aspects of daily life."

### **Boater's Safety Course on tap for Sunday**

SOUTH FALLSBURG -The Sullivan County Sheriff's Office Marine Patrol Unit will host a one-day New York State Boater's Safety Course on Sunday July 10 from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the Fallsburg Fire Department at 17 Lake Street in South Fallsburg.

The minimum age to attend is 10 years old and attendees must pass a written test at the end of the session. This is a perfect opportunity for the whole family to attend.

Anyone born after May 1, 1996 is now required to pass an approved course in boater education in order operate a motorboat in New York State. All operators of personal watercraft (jets skis & wave runners) must be at least 14 and possess the

safety certificate.

There is no charge for this course. New York State will charge a fee of \$10 for the boaters safety certificate which does not expire. The fee is waived for students less than 18 years old.

To sign up for the class call the Sheriff's Patrol at 794-7100, press option 1. and speak with the deputy on the desk.
