Individualized Self-Directed Learning


Self Directed Learning is when the student takes ownership over how they learn.

The students are guided towards what they are expected to know, but the students get to choose how they find the knowledge. They choose how they learn and how they show their work. The teacher becomes a resource rather than a manager.

# With Self Directed

Learning, the students make choices about how they learn best: the teacher's role is to hold them accountable for those choices. The choice is never not to work, the choice is how the student wants to work.

The result is a less stressful environment for students and teachers. The students have a variety of ways to show their work and engage further into their studies.




### When is your child actively engaged?

Passionate engagement is most likely when children are free to choose what they do. While young children cannot be autonomous in many ways, kids of all ages can choose what they learn about. Even within a structured curriculum, a great deal of time can be devoted to self-directed learning.

We take advantage of students' interests and passions to fully engage them in learning. This promotes engagement of the whole brain (experience, investigation, knowledge and application) during lessons. Students discover strategies to use when confronting new challenges.

Our classrooms provide the opportunity for students to work at their own pace and level of complexity depending on the subject, the topic within that subject and the strength area of the student. This allows the students to have choices in how they are going to learn the objectives required by Alberta Learning curriculum.

### **Upper Elementary Program**

Students are challenged to become responsible learners by teaching them research skills to discover new information independently. Students determine how long they need to complete their objectives, how they are going to learn the material, and how they will show what they have learned. Through collaboration with teachers and peers, students learn to use resources and manage their time effectively.

### **Junior High and High School Program**

Students in the junior high and high school program take ownership over their learning with the guidance of our High School Director. They learn responsibility and accountability in order to prepare for post-secondary education. The students create their own schedules for the day and participate in teacher conferences to guide their learning.
