Neigh Day! Churchill Downs Racing Out Of Online Sports Betting, Casino

Churchill Downs (CDI) is winding down its online sports betting and casino business. Churchill Downs CEO Bill Carstanjen said the company could not see a path to profit in a "highly competitive market." No 'regard' for profit? As a result, Carstanjen said the online business including **sports betting** will be wound down over the next six months.

"When the Supreme Court overturned the ban on sports betting in 2018, we had high hopes for building a profitable business in this space," Carstanjen said. "We have profitable retail books in four of our casinos.

"However, the online betting and casino space is highly competitive with an ever-increasing number of participants. Many are pursuing maximum market
