

A note from the Executive Director

New Beginnings, New Growth...

Spring is a season of new beginnings, of new growth. During this 2018 spring season, MEarth is experiencing its fair share of both.

The organization has a new executive director. We are hiring three new staff to replace existing staff who are moving on. We have begun implementing a new Sustainable Business Plan, which includes more programming for adults. Finally, we are in the initial stages of planning a ten-year anniversary celebration next fall —MEarth secured its nonprofit status on December 16, 2008.

Another new beginning we will soon implement is to more regularly ask you to consider providing the financial nutrients MEarth needs to grow, so we can better meet our mission: to educate and inspire through environmental stewardship. Historically, we have formally and directly asked for your financial support at the end of the year. The financial and emotional support we have received during that time has been significant and inspirational.

MEarth's Board and staff would like to make the most of that strong community support, by offering you the opportunity to make a financial contribution more than once a year. We want to provide our supporters with timely and compelling requests four times a year, the norm for most nonprofits. Starting next month, we will begin sending out funding appeals to coincide with the four growing seasons of the year.

The spring appeal will focus on something new, related to the time of year to plant seeds. The goal might be a new program or some new equipment, such as a new Edible

Landscape workshop, or remote sensor cameras to track wildlife movement on The Hilton Bialek Habitat.

The summer appeal would pertain to an organizational need that is in, or about to, bloom. For example, we want to bring more students from elsewhere in Monterey County to MEarth for environmental education.

The fall appeal will address some aspect of MEarth that is ready for harvest. As an example, we have a desire to bring a renowned speaker to our 10th anniversary celebration.

Finally, the year-end appeal is our time to share with you MEarth's plan for the next growing season. As has been MEarth's tradition, this is when we ask for your general support to help MEarth start the new year on a strong financial footing.

Our intention is to give you the opportunity to support MEarth in a way that best fits your interests. We want you to be the seed of MEarth's growth. Knowing how much fun it is to plant a seed and watch it grow, we want you to be the one who decides which MEarth seed you want to help plant, or which MEarth plant you want to help grow. And our gratitude for your support will be matched by our commitment to make the most of the financial nutrients you provide.


FoodConnect

Food is essential to our existence. Yet, in the hustle and bustle of our modern life, we often become disconnected from our food sources. Through MEarth's FoodConnect program, students of all ages and socio-economic backgrounds experience first hand the simple act harvesting, cooking, and connecting to their food. This takes place in our LEED-certified culinary classroom, wood-fired oven, organic edible garden, heirloom fruit orchard, off-grid solar greenhouse, and native plant nursery.

In partnership with the Monterey County Health Department and their program **Nutrition Education and Obesity Prevention**, we have been able to provide FoodConnect field trips to underserved youth in our community. We offer out-of-school and school day programs that highlight healthy eating and sustainable living. These field trips provide students the opportunity to experiment and learn about F.L.O.S.S. Fresh, Local, Organic, Seasonal, and Sustainable food makes for healthy and thriving communities.
