My personal journey with PIN started a little before it was born, with a small casual lunch get-together with ladies who were strangers with nothing more than a common love for sarees.


Namita Surlekar welcomed me with her very warm smile and caring talk while

Strong team to identify the
best carrier to ship
packages — FedEx or USPS
— and the most costeffective way of shipping
them. We receive donations
of sarees from all over the
USA. These were curated
and sold at very low prices
to encourage recycling and
reuse. Thank you for your
generous donations and
support.

In the past year, we have shipped to more than 64 locations all over the 48 contiguous United States and also mailed some packages to Alaska and Hawaii. In addition, we mailed some packages to military addresses. Packing and shipping is largely a manual process. Going forward, we are planning to automate it, so donors can be alerted of a shipment and track their packages.
